Happy New Year and welcome to the *By The Way*! I am your new CCFAA Chairperson. My name is John E. It is an honor and a privilege to be of service to you.

I have a wonderful expectancy about the upcoming year. We have a lot to do this year, as we have also had in the past. I thank the outgoing CCFAA trusted servants for doing a great job during a sometimes very difficult term. I wish them the best as I also wish for all of you. I love AA and hope that it is always there for the newcomer, for you and for me.

Let me get to the main point here. For whatever reason, Central Office is having economic problems similar to those being experienced in the State and around the world at this time. Central Office provides AA literature for sale to groups and individuals; is an integral part of tele-service; publishes and distributes meeting directories, group flyers and the newsletter (this *By The Way*). We can ill afford to lose this essential part of our local AA community.

It appears that we will need to dip into our prudent reserve (the reserve consists of a little less than four months of operating expenses) to operate Central Office. Of course, as one member friend of mine told me this morning, "that's what the prudent reserve is for, John!" True, but for a limited short term emergency only!

What is the solution? For now it is love, service and generosity. We must dig deep, particularly in the next few critical months and increase our funding to Central Office through group and individual contributions. I thank those groups who have been contributing regularly and remind everyone that small contributions add up. This is truly a group effort. In addition, for the last several months the Office Manager has been doing the work of more than two people, often working seventy or eighty hours a week. We need volunteers to help out at the office. We also need to look to different ways to carry the message and different methods, such as the internet website, www.aasacramento.org, and new, less expensive, more cost effective ways to publish the *By The Way*, group flyers and meeting schedules (some of these new ways were presented to the Delegates at the monthly CCFAA meeting on January 17th). We may need to slightly increase the cost of some of the literature so that we can stay afloat.

In closing, let's all work together to ensure the future of Central Office in Sacramento.
