III. Trusted Servant Reports

A. Chairperson – John E. - Present/Report E-mailed

The office manager has hired a new assistant who is working five hours a day as permanent part-time help. The new assistant will serve a probationary period as required by the By-laws.

The new CCFAA Treasurer and new CPA continue to work many hours to discover the truth about the financial status of the Office and CCFAA. Some questionable bookkeeping practices from the past continue to cause confusion, but more is being revealed daily. One major discovery is that there appears to have been a failure to file IRS forms, specifically the #990 Form, Federal Information Return, in May of 2003 (taxes for the year 2002) that carries a penalty of \$50 per day if enforced by the IRS. It appears that the Office Manager had filed those forms in previous years, and even though evidence indicates that the former bookkeeper completed the forms for the May filing, the filing never took place, according to the IRS.

It is not known why the forms were not filed last May by the Office Manager, or if they were filed, why the IRS has no record of the filing. Our new CPA accountant has been working on this problem with the IRS. More will be revealed and you will be kept informed at each step.

I commend the Office Operations Committee for its diligent work in attempting to "right the ship" and stop the relentless loss of money that has befallen the Central Office over what now looks like the last several years. It appears that the method of operation was such that no one other than the former Office Manager was aware of the actual financial status. As suggested by the former OOC, it appears that several items of the CCFAA By-Laws and Office Operations Procedures had not been complied with for a relatively long period of time. Suggestions have been made that an independent audit of the last 5 years or so of business transactions take place to determine the actual financial status of CCFAA and to help determine what happened to the money. The Office Operations Committee is contemplating such an audit, though the cost of such an audit might be prohibitive at this time, along with other potential solutions and will keep the delegates informed at each and every step. A reminder that if money is to be spent in a manner other than shown in the current delegate-approved budget, that there must be a delegate-approved amendment to the 2004 budget, prior to the money being expended (By-Laws, Article VIII, Section 8.08).

Next, we are seeking a volunteer to chair the Ad-Hoc Picnic Committee for the annual CCFAA picnic in August. I would like to appoint the committee chair next month, with Delegate approval. Please take this message to your groups so that we can move forward next month on this issue.

Finally, I want to encourage all the Delegates to request members of their groups to volunteer for service at the Central Office and to ask their groups to have patience with the new trusted servants, who have only been in service for less than one month and are still learning their jobs, to be tolerant of all and to generously contribute funds to ensure the future of Central Office.
