When the fourth edition of the Big Book came out in late 2001, we lowered the price by one dollar for two main reasons: first, to say thank you to the Fellowship for all the hard work put into making this new edition; and second, because we anticipated sales revenue would push us over the limits of the reserve fund. Sales stayed so strong that we kept the discount for over two years. Big Book sales have now leveled off, and we will restore the original price on July 1, 2004. The price reinstatement will affect the Big Book in English, French, and Spanish. The price of the hardcover Big Books (B1,FB1,SB1) will be restored to \$6.00; and the soft cover (B30, FB30, SB30) will be restored to \$5.60. The price of the boxed set of the Big Book and Experience, Strength and Hope will also rise one dollar, to \$14.00. Other formats and languages will not be affected. Due to the increase in costs Central Office will raise our prices July 1, 2004.
