This is in reference to selling non-AA/AA items either before, during, or after AA meetings occurring either in the meeting hall or in the parking lot.

Tradition Six: “An AA group ought never endorse, finance or lend the A.A. name to any related facility or outside enterprise, lest problems of money, property or prestige divert us from our primary purpose”.

Since each group is autonomous, groups can decide how they wish to handle the situation you are describing. Groups are encouraged to buy and sell Conference-approved Literature. There are groups that decide to sell other books published by Hazledon or some other agency, which is a group decision. Selling tickets, tokens, and medallions outside the meeting room, for example, in the parking lot or after a meeting is something your group will need to discuss since basically the group has a responsibility in the meeting hall where they rent space. I can't say that a group that rents space in the parking lot too is off limits. The matter would need to be discussed with the landlord.

The Traditions are neither rules, regulations nor laws, they are guidelines for all groups, and they were built out of mistakes and the strength of the Twelve Traditions lie in the interpretation of them. Someone who is trying to sell things out in the parking lot is just simply not in the spirit of this Tradition but there may be nothing that the group can do about it since that is not in the meeting hall.

Good luck in the decisions you and your group make.

Subject: Amendments to the Bylaws and Operating Procedures for Central California Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous

Date: April 15, 2004

Preamble

At this time the Office Operations Committee (OOC) is not able to conduct business in an orderly manner. There are no provisions in the bylaws relating to the conduct of the OOC meeting. This greatly hinders the members in trying to conduct business.

Much of the business this committee conducts requires a working knowledge of the operations of this office and the effect of changes to these operations. Explanations to occasional visitors extend the time required to finish the business of the meeting.

Note: Additions are in bold type.

Proposed amendment to the OPERATING PROCEDURES

SECTION IX. OFFICE OPERATIONS COMMITTEE.

1. The Office Operations Committee shall meet as required, but no less than once per month. The Office Operations Committee meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order" As presented in the book "Robert's Rules in Plain English", by Doris P. Zimmerman.

13. Attendees at meetings of The Office Operations Committee that are not members of the committee shall observe only. They are not to ask questions, make statements, or hinder the meeting in any way. This paragraph does not apply to Persons invited by the committee.

14. Attendees at meetings of The Office Operations Committee that are not members of the committee are not allowed to be present when this committee conducts business relating to personnel issues.

ARTICLE VIII. OFFICE OPERATIONS COMMITTEE.

Section 8.03. The Chairperson of the Office Operations Committee shall be elected by the committee members. The Chairperson must be selected from the four (4) elected Delegates. **This election shall be conducted without regard to the number of vacant member positions. All of the elected delegates need not be present for this election to be conducted.**

Delegates will be provided with written copies of these proposed changes at the June Delegates meeting. And a review from the By-Laws and Procedures committee will be presented at that time. A vote on these changes will be at least 2 months and more likely 3 months from this time.

B. A motion is made to confirm the intent of the By-laws that allow visitors to the OOC meeting. This motion stipulates that the intent of said by-laws is that visitors be silent observers only so as to allow the OOC to conduct its business in an expedient and orderly fashion. Motion seconded. Discussion ensued. Vote is 27 in favor, 6 opposed, 1 abstention. The motion carries.

C. A motion to void the three-month review contract entered into between the OOC and the Office Manager and proceed as the By-Laws state with a six-month review is made and seconded. Lengthy and heated discussion ensued. Vote is 2 in favor, 15 opposed. Motion defeated.

D. A motion to continue the use of the Visa/Debit Card which is attached to the General Fund account, but with the stipulation that it is to be used only for the CCFAA website is made and seconded. Discussion ensued. Vote is 23 in favor, 2 opposed. The motion carries.

At this time Butch R. requests that it be noted by the Delegate Body and published in the By-the-Way, that there is currently no Visa card, issued to or applied for by, the Central Office.

E. A motion is made to perform the Office Audit on June 5th. Motion is seconded. Vote is Unanimous in favor. The motion carries.

G. Motion to Adjourn is made and seconded. Vote is unanimous in favor. Meeting adjourned.

Proposed amendments to the bylaws

The purpose of these amendments is to help the Office Operations Committee (OOC) conduct meetings in an orderly manner and more accurately define existing bylaws.

Amendment

The Office Operations Committee meetings shall be conducted in accordance with Roberts Rules of Order As presented in the book "Robert's Rules in Plain English", by Doris P. Zimmerman.

This will allow the committee to follow the most common set of rules used in this type of meeting. These rules have been refined since the beginning of this country. They allow both the minority and majority to have their concerns addressed.

This particular book is designed for easy use in small organizations. It does not contain the more complicated rules required by state or federal organizations. Almost all incorporated entities specify a particular publication to avoid confusions that would hinder the conduct of business.

Amendment

Attendees at meetings of The Office Operations Committee that are not members of the committee shall observe only. They are not to ask questions, make statements, or hinder the meeting in any way. This paragraph does not apply to Persons invited by the committee.

This establishes the fact that the meetings are “open” and can be attended by anyone. But, only members are allowed to discuss the issue. This will save time explaining the background knowledge needed to understand the issue at hand. It will also prevent uniformed persons from making statements that are incorrect and/or not relevant to the subject.

The last sentence is to allow the committee to hear from persons (non-members) that can provide input needed to help the members make decisions. These include sales representatives, hired consultants, etc.

Amendment

Attendees at meetings of The Office Operations Committee that are not members of the committee are not allowed to be present when this committee conducts business relating to personnel issues.

At times the committee must discuss issues relating to current or prospective employees. This amendment allows the discussion of personal matters without infringing on the (prospective) employees right to privacy.

Amendment

This election shall be conducted without regard to the number of vacant member positions. All of the elected delegates need not be present for this election to be conducted.

It has been interpreted that the sentence preceding this means that all 4 positions must be filled and that all four members must be present before a chairperson can be elected. This clarifies that misunderstanding.
