Y o u n g , S o b e r , a n d F r e e

Growing up, I never felt as if I fit in. I drank to fit in, to escape and to just shut off the loud clatter that was going on in my head. I remember the warm feeling that came at once from that first drink. I identify with other AAs when they say that they felt bigger, stronger, and better looking after taking a drink. Growing up as an alcoholic teenager, I didn't have much. I didn't think alcohol would take away the little I had left. My self-esteem, dignity, respect, and sense of self were thrown along the wayside for King Alcohol. When I finally arrived in AA, I was eighteen years old, barely passing high school, and had just beaten a manslaughter charge.

My first few months were hard. I remember being angry a lot and spending a lot of time in fear. (Hell, who am I fooling? If I weren't practicing these spiritual principles, I'd be living in fear right now.) They asked me if I was willing to go to any lengths and I said yes, if they could make the pain go away. I was so beat-up emotionally, I just wanted a way out. I would have killed myself but I didn't have the guts. I worked my Steps and got involved, then took more commitments so I would stay involved. My first year was crazy. I beat the civil suit I was involved in as a result of the manslaughter, I got a job, and attended junior college.

I spent a lot of time hanging out with people in the program. This is what I needed. We hung out until all hours of the night. I remember I never woke up before noon on a regular basis until I had few years sober. Today I like to wake up early.

When I was sober a few years, I got involved in a young people's committee called the Greater San Diego Young People's committee. Little did I know my life was about to change. The committee threw events for young people and also bid for our state conference ACYPAA every year. It was a blast! We would load up the car and travel to the Bay area just to attend meetings and conventions. We went to dances, parties, and other AA functions, dragging newcomers wherever we went.

When I was sober five years, I went off to college. That was difficult because I had to attend new meetings, and I discovered they did AA wrong. I graduated in two years and moved back to San Diego. I got involved in Young People's again, going to meetings and all the functions, and I found the greatest thing ever—sponsorship. I started working with a lot of newcomers. I always had heard that this was the point of the program, but hadn't realized it until then. I'd spent all my time thinking about myself and how much fun I could have.

I learned so much from working with others. I got a sense of ease and comfort that I used to get from alcohol. We took homeless drunks to dinner, then tried to talk them into going to detox. This worked for a few

When I was sober eight years, I applied to grad school and was accepted. I then moved back to northern California and had to get involved in new meetings. That is where I am now. I just celebrated my ninth-year sobriety birthday and wanted to write this to share my experience, strength, and hope with those of you out there getting sober when you're young.

I have a great life today, all due to a loving and giving Higher Power. I have to remember that without him, I am nothing. He is the miracle, and I am not. I try to stay really humble. Today, I try to live a spiritual life and practice these principles in all my affairs. I spend my time giving back what I have found in AA, sponsoring, speaking, giving rides, whatever I can do. Sometimes I get bored, and what a blessing being bored in sobriety is. This is when my head stops running and I feel calm and serene. I'm excited about my future; I know that if I stay close to God I will have a magnificent one.

Tax penalty

The CPA reported that a Form 990 was required to be filed with the Internal Revenue Service in May, 2003 reporting our financial statements for the tax year 2002. It was not submitted. At this time we have been assessed a penalty of \$5,200.00. There is a possibility that we can get this abated. If needed, it must be mailed by July 26. This payment needs to be authorized so a check can be issued. This is not a budget item. The same form for the tax year 2003 has been filed.

Audit

At the last CCFAA meeting we tabled a motion in reference to an audit of the Central Office. An audit would cost from three to five thousand dollars. We do not have all of the records needed to perform an audit for 2003. The bookkeeper has not returned the documents from that year. Our CPA had to establish the year end balances before posting activity for 2004. An auditor could only duplicate the work she has done.

An audit may reveal discrepancies. However, in line with AA policy, no action would be taken. This makes the audit of no real value to us.

Office Security and Access

The issue of office security and access was discussed. A motion was made and past that a key to the office be held by the Chairperson of the OOC.

Status

At the last delegates meeting I said in my report that this committee has stabilized and has a good working relationship. I also asked the groups that no longer contribute to reevaluate their decision. Unfortunately this proved to be incorrect.

Immediately prior to my report a member of the OOC made a motion that the Treasurer be asked to resign. The Treasurer is on the OOC. He also wanted the delegates to know how each member of the OOC voted on the disapproval of the probationary contract with the Office Manager.

Document

At this time the OOC has been divided by a document presented to the committee at the meeting of June 15. This document was presented by the Office Manager. It is neither dated nor signed. We spent approximately 8 hours discussing this. It is over seventy pages in length. This document contains many false, inaccurate and/or misleading statements.

One of the most effective ways to incite discord in an organization is to present half truths and inflammatory statements. It is often referred to as a "He said - she said" argument. This tactic is particularly effective when you can involve several statements made by several persons relative to several subjects.

These complaints were directed at several persons. Some of the persons mentioned are no longer associated with CCFAA. We did not discuss statements made about them. Nor did we discuss any of the statements about persons who have contracted with CCFAA. Almost all of the situations in the document are situations that should have been resolved by the Office Manager at the time they happened. A revised version of this document was mailed to 116 persons. This mailing and the information in it were not mailed with the knowledge, approval or authorization of the OOC.

Some of the people in that document have been told that a complaint has been filed with State of California, Department of Employment and Fair Housing. It has been stated that a Right to Sue letter has been issued by that department. We have been told that a law suit has been filed. Much of this document is written in the third person and quotes what appears to be advice from an attorney or other third party. I am named by title in that document. This forces me into an adversarial position. I have issued a statement of facts in reference to this document.

Roger, as Chairperson of CCFA, has repeatedly requested those of us named in that document talk to him so that he can mediate the situation.

- We have made our response at the OOC meeting.
- No demands have been made that can be mediated.
- He has also stated that "No law suit has been file." We can only assume that he has information that has not been made available to us.
- We can only proceed on the statements made by Bathena D.
-

CPA request

The CPA presented a copy of the document mentioned earlier. She stated that the comments about her conduct are false. She also considers them an attack on her profession reputation. She requested that this be stopped. Bethena told the CPA she will here from the Board of Accountancy. Some of the members are not in a position to make a motion on the request. No motions were made. No action against the CPA has been authorized, taken or done with the approval of the OOC.

Mailing

A major error occurred on June 30th between the website and the printed issue of By The Way for July. The wording of the OOC's decision to not offer a one year contract was changed. The word "not" was missing. An E-mail letter and phone call to the CCFAA chair to point out this inconsistency was sent on June 30th, advising our CCFAA chair of this error and also to have him make certain of the correction. It was further requested that any corrections being sent out be passed by the OOC members for review. This was not done. A mailing was made to approximately 116 persons was made. It is eleven pages long. The last page contains a portion of the BTE with the wording change. No explanation was made that this is a correction.

That mailing also contained a report how each member voted. I do not imply that the statement is correct or not. As chairperson of the committee I deeply regret that the confidentiality of this meeting has been was violated.

*Response to Fiscal Health Report
By the CCFAA Ad Hoc Fiscal Health Committee
As of June 2004*

At the Delegate's meeting in March 2004, an Ad Hoc Committee was formed to examine issues submitted, in a memo, to the CCFAA Delegate body regarding the Fiscal Health of the CCFAA Central Office.

In summary, although CCFAA revenues remain healthy and expenses are within an acceptable range of the budget for 2004, the managing of Central Office and the accounting and reporting provided by Central Office to the CCFAA community are less than satisfactory.

When this Committee made requests for payroll time records, backed up computer data, procedural files or instructions, the check register, archived By The Way copies, and other office information, the following information was provided:

- The files (procedural, personnel and backup DVDs) are missing and no one knows where they are.
- No paper copies were ever kept of time sheets for salaried employees, but everything was performed electronically from August through December 2003.
- The computer crashed so the above-mentioned electronic files are no longer available. The former Chair of the IT Committee indicated that there was no crash.
- Things either disappeared or went missing after the office asbestos cleanup and no one knows what happened.
- There are no backup disks of any of the historical accounting and financial data. The former Chair of the IT Committee indicated that there was backed up data in the form of three DVD's.
- The Office Manager does not know why the clerk was given back pay for a period of time that was prior to approval given to hire the clerk last November. A clerk was also paid in March 2004, but there are no time sheet records to support the payment.

Many of the bulleted items addressed in the body of this report have since been resolved, explained or are addressed by the Committee in recommendations for future improvements. Errors have been made as new Trusted Servants learned undocumented procedures, added new technologies and as new staff and Servants tried to learn the procedures without the benefit of transition with prior members. All of those items are to be expected and with ongoing cooperation, respect for each other and continued willingness to serve all of the items bulleted in the body of this report will be resolved.

This Committee would like to thank the Office Manager, the CCFAA Treasurer, the CPA Accountant and the former IT Ad Hoc Committee for their assistance and cooperation as we researched the issues in this report.

What is important to address from this point forward is the underlying instability of office operations, the lack of standard business procedures and the difficulties the office is experiencing while it attempts to chart its new course in response to the major changes this past year. This is shown by the present condition of Central Office that includes no licenses for the software, lack of and missing information, difficulties with accountability and remaining confusion on the procedures between the OOC and the Office Manager.

After close examination of the issues presented below, the Ad Hoc Fiscal Health Committee respectfully submits their findings and recommendations to the CCFAA Delegates in the body of this report.

We charge the CCFAA Trusted Servants with the responsibility to keep the Fellowship informed, to practice the AA Traditions and Concepts, to support the CCFAA By Laws and Operating Procedures and to represent the good of the AA community in the resolution of the continuing problems within Central Office.

 3. Currently these parties are threatening to sue each other and me for various reasons.
 4. My suggestion is mediation between the OOC and the office manager.
