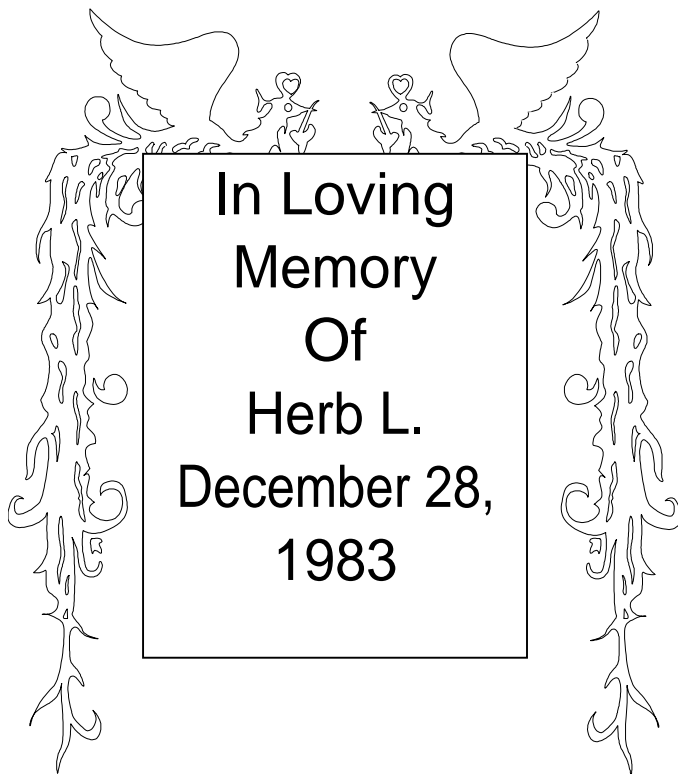

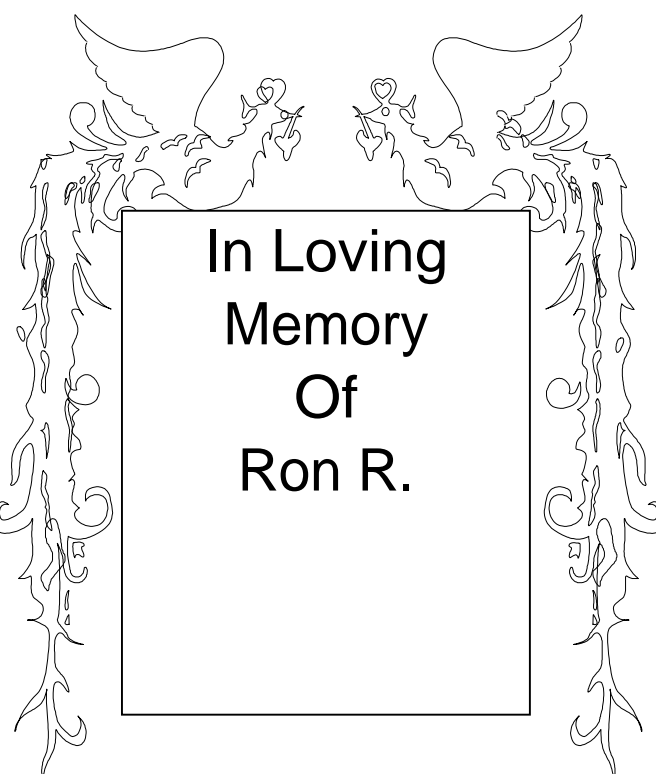

## T R U S T E D S E R V A N T

One Summer I was staying in an obscure town in Northern California. I made myself at home in the local A.A. fellowship. One weekend some of us got together at the local coffee bar, and we were talking about meetings and going to new groups and checking them out. We had some discussion about how we would like to go do more different meetings in some of the smaller burgs around the area. So from the discussion came an idea for a fun group called "going to any lengths" we formed as a group and met once a month to select the meetings that we would attend. We had some fun with this because we couldn't agree upon what meetings to attend (darn alcoholism) so we decided to use a copy of the meeting schedule and a dart to make the picks, 4 weeks, 4 meetings. This went on for several months and we had gone to a lot of different meetings, met a lot of new friends and picked up a whole bunch of new members for the group to ride with.

Now we got together this one evening in the early fall and headed out to a meeting that was a long way out in the middle of nowhere according to the map. Some were very reluctant to go due to the location, and the fact that no one had ever been to this place before. So with a little groaning and a stop at the coffee bar we were off. This meeting was in a place off the beaten path, and it was taking longer than we thought it would to get to the destination, so there was more groaning and moaning but soon we saw the lights of the small community grounds for that Sheep Ranching co-op. According to the schedule the meeting was held in a co-op community center.

When we pulled in we were about 10 minutes early, and there was just one car out front and so we went inside to see if we were in the right place.

We entered the Quonset hut style building into a small conference room like area. Off in one corner was a set of five or six chairs with a small desk facing them and off to the side was a neat little table with two coffee pots one very tiny and one regular sized. Neatly placed next to the coffee area was a small table with a neat AA literature rack complete with a new Big Book and 12x12. All in all it looked to be just another meeting room. Little did we know that we had just walked into a very special spirit filled meeting.

Now this is not to say that any other meeting have any less spiritual significance, it is just that a power greater than us was at work on this evening for the special person that was the trusted servant of this meeting.

From an another room, entered a small woman of some years, at least 60 although she wore them well, she said "I thought I was hearing things" and laughed nervously, and then she let out a strong and healthy "welcome" and extended her arms with giddy giggles, and small tears, she hugged each of us in welcome while telling us her little story.

We will use the name "Jane" for The purpose of anonymity.

Jane cleared a hitch in her throat and thru her tears she said "I am going to need to make more coffee" and we all broke out in laughter. Jane told us of her little group and its history. Jane has been a member of the Cottonwood Group of A.A. for 8 years; she had been sober for many more. Jane told of how she had been coming to this little room and putting out the chairs and making her little pot of coffee. The number of people who had made the meeting have never been more than three. Jane told us of how she had been given the opportunity to 12 step a few men from the community but they either moved to other places or drank again.

The thing that made the biggest impression on me, and many of the others with us was that Jane had been coming and opening this meeting every Wednesday night and at times she sat in the room with only God and her Big Book. It touched my heart to know that this woman had gone to the lengths of opening the doors. She had taken on the responsibility to open the doors to have a place for Alcoholics to come and have a meeting.

When looked back on, we had been going to great lengths to go to as many different meetings as we could. God had surely in his infinite wisdom allowed us to see many examples of going to any lengths; however I have to say that Jane was an example of going to any lengths that I hope that I can emulate in my life. Jane was also an inspiration of the fact that Sobriety is such a gift and I have so much to be thankful for. I can never give back to God and A.A. what it has given to me.

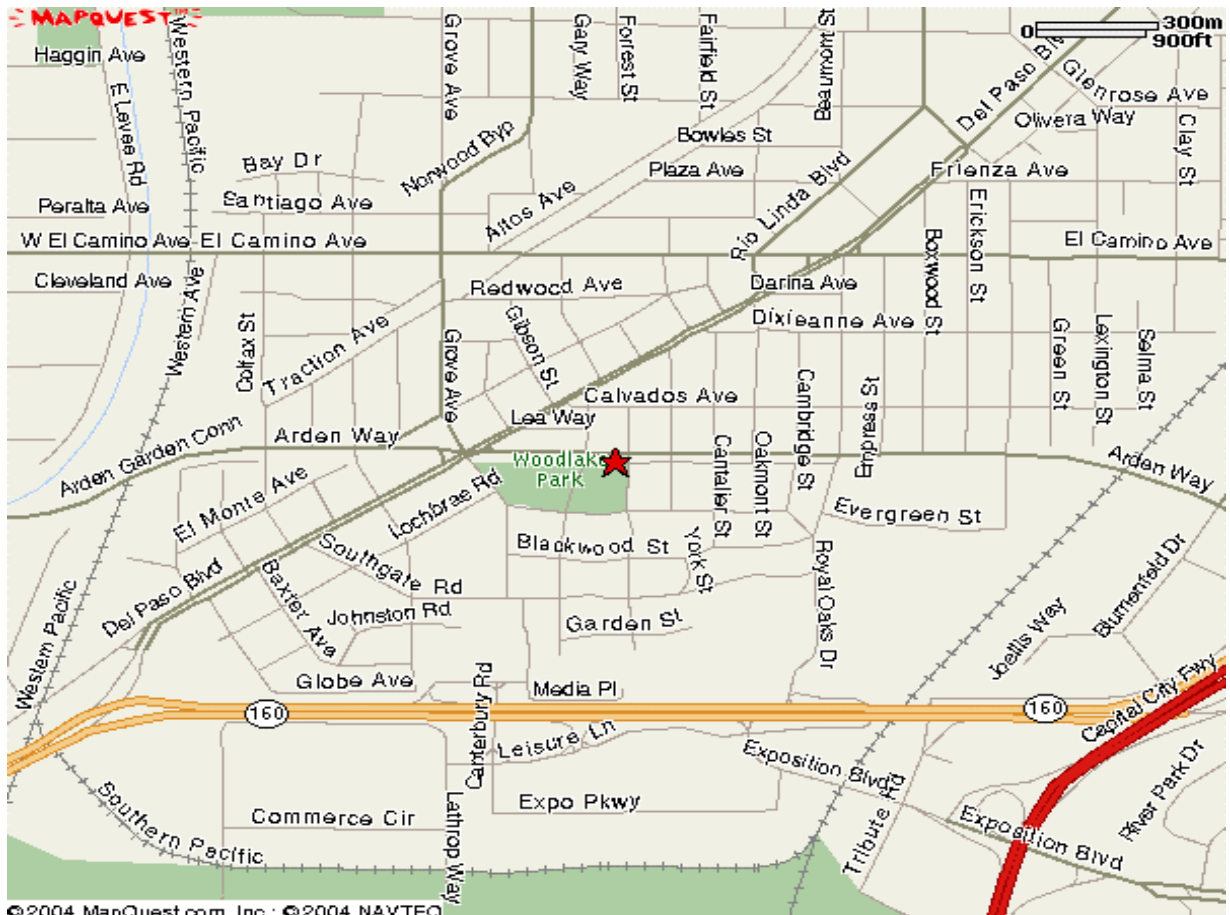
### ***I asked our Area Chair, Mark C. "What has H & I done for you?"***
