SPIRITUAL EXPERIENCE

The terms “spiritual experience” and “spiritual awakening” are used many times in this book which, upon careful reading, shows that the personality change sufficient to bring about recovery from alcoholism has manifested itself among us in many different forms.

Yet it is true that our first printing gave many readers the impression that these personality changes, or religious experiences, must be in the nature of sudden and spectacular upheavals. Happily for everyone, this conclusion is erroneous.

In the first few chapters a number of sudden revolutionary changes are described. Though it was not our intention to create such an impression, many alcoholics have nevertheless concluded that in order to recover they must acquire an immediate and overwhelming “God-consciousness” followed at once by a vast change in feeling and outlook.

Among our rapidly growing membership of thousands of alcoholics such transformations, though frequent, are by no means the rule. Most of our experiences are what the psychologist William James calls the “educational variety” because they develop slowly over a period of time. Quite often friends of the newcomer are aware of the difference long before he is himself. He finally realizes that he has undergone a profound alteration in his reaction to life; that such a change could hardly have been brought about by himself alone. What often takes place in a few months could seldom have been accomplished by years of self-discipline. With few exceptions our members find that they have tapped an unsuspected inner resource which they presently identify with their own conception of a Power greater than themselves.

Most of us think this awareness of a Power greater than ourselves is the essence of spiritual experience. Our more religious members call it “God-consciousness.”

Most emphatically we wish to say that any alcoholic capable of honestly facing his problems in the light of our experience can recover, provided he does not close his mind to all spiritual concepts. He can only be defeated by an attitude of intolerance or belligerent denial.

We find that no one need have difficulty with the spirituality of the program. *Willingness, honesty and open mindedness are the essentials of recovery. But these are indispensable.*

THE RELIGIOUS VIEW ON A.A.

Clergymen of practically every denomination have given A.A. their blessing.

Edward Dowling, S.J.,* of the Queen’s Work staff, says, “Alcoholics Anonymous is natural; it is natural at the point where nature comes closest to the supernatural, namely in humiliations and in consequent humility. There is something spiritual about an art museum or a symphony, and the Catholic Church approves of our use of them. There is something spiritual about A.A. too, and Catholic participation in it almost invariably results in poor Catholics becoming better Catholics.”

The Episcopal magazine, *The Living Church*, observes editorially: “The basis of the technique of Alcoholics Anonymous is the truly Christian principle that a man cannot help himself except by helping others. The A.A. plan is described by the members themselves as ‘self-insurance.’ This self-insurance has resulted in the restoration of physical, mental and spiritual health and self-respect to hundreds of men and women who would be hopelessly down and out without its unique but effective therapy.”

Speaking at a dinner given by John D. Rockefeller Jr. to introduce Alcoholics Anonymous to some of his friends, Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick remarked: “I think that psychologically speaking there is a point of advantage in the approach that is being made in this movement that cannot be duplicated. I suspect that if it is wisely handled—and it seems to be in wise and prudent hands—there are doors of opportunity ahead of this project that may surpass our capacities to imagine.”

Did You Know?

Now -- talking with Dr. Bob – I remembered all that Dr. Silkworth had said. So I went very slowly on the fireworks of religious experience. I just talked away about my own case until he got a good identification with me, until he began to say, “Yes that’s me, I’m like that.”

Dr. Bob at the time of our first meeting was fifty-five, some fifteen years older than I. He must have had an iron constitution. He said that all through the years his drinking had been practically continuous. When he got too jittery to operate or to see patients, he sedated himself heavily. When this recourse sometimes failed he would steal away for a week or so to a drying-out place so that he could start the same cycle all over again. In those rare moments when he got thoroughly sober, the insatiable craving for alcohol never let up.

Yet he seemed to have no serious neurotic difficulties. As he often put it, “I just loved my grog.” By the time I met him this compelling love had almost done him in.

Anne verged on a nervous crackup, and their two children were of course greatly upset. Such was the payoff of twenty-five years of alcoholism. *ope* was a word they had come to avoid. In our first conversation I bore down heavily on the medical hopelessness of Dr. Bob’s case, freely using Dr. Silkworth’s words describing the alcoholic’s dilemma, the “obsession plus allergy” theme. Though Bob was a doctor, this was news to him, bad news. Always better versed in spiritual matters than I, he had paid little attention to that aspect of my story. *Even though he could not make them work, he already knew what the spiritual answers were.* What really did hit him hard was the medical business, the verdict of the inevitable annihilation. And the fact that I was an alcoholic And knew what I was talking about from personal experience made the blow a shattering one.

In Dr. Bob’s story as afterwards written for the A.A. book, and years later in his last full-length talk at Detroit, he made this point very clear: it was not any spiritual teaching of mine, rather it was those twin ogres of madness and death, the allergy plus the obsession, that triggered him into a new life. It was Dr. Silkworth’s idea, confirmed by William James, that struck him at great depth.

You see, our talk was a completely *mutual* thing. I had quit preaching. I knew that I needed this alcoholic as much as he needed me. *This was it.* And this mutual give-and-take is at the very heart of all A.A.’s Twelfth Step work today. This was how to carry the message. The final missing link was located right here in my first talk with Dr. Bob.

A. CCFAA Chairperson – Dale (Absent) – Assistant Chairperson Bill P noted that Dale was out of town and unavailable for this meeting. A Recording Secretary is still needed and asked if anyone is interested in serving – no one came forward at this time. Did not attend the CNIA meeting as they were having their Post Conference Assembly.

B. Office Operations Committee Chairperson – Valerie C: A written report of the OOC Meeting on May 17, 2005 was handed out. New York advised that all books except the Big Book would have a increase of \$1.00. Central Office will begin the higher price September 1, 2005. Valerie noted a vote would be needed under New Business regarding a Financial Audit and Expenses for Central Office Manager's Annual Conference.

OOO Supplemental Report: Systems Administrator

This report is written to inform the delegates and general membership of the steps being taken to improve the accuracy of CCFAA's financial reporting by Central Office.

2003 was a tumultuous year for CCFAA where radical changes were made at Central Office. Interim and temporary staff members were unable to maintain consistent records of all financial transactions which resulted in errors and inaccuracies. There were failures to file tax returns, and accounting disputes with New York that strained relations to the point that New York refused to fill literature orders until the accounts were reconciled; that is to say until CCFAA paid their arrears. Also the OOC administration of that year were dissatisfied with the Bookkeeper/Accountant of that time and terminated that relationship with unresolved issues.

Needless to say, 2004 began with inherited problems. Neither the financial data nor the inventory data at the beginning of the year were correct, nor were these data entered into the accounting system until some three months of the new year had passed. The new CPA introduced new accounting software and much effort was made during that year to resolve the past issues and restore current accuracy. Sadly 2004 was also a tumultuous year where we saw the OOC staff turn over approximately 2 ½ times, the Office Manager abruptly terminated, the Office Assistant resigning, cash of an unaccounted amount that could be as much as \$2000.00 stolen from the safe, fraudulent use of the CCFAA ATM card (a mysterious withdrawal of \$500.00), and full reliance upon an untrained, inexperienced interim Office Manager for three months of the year. All who tried to help the situation had too little information and often insufficient expertise.

Because many of the resulting consequences can never be resolved, the financial reports are and will continue to be irretrievably FUBAR until CCFAA cuts ties with the past. This then is part of the proposal.

The 2005 OOC administration has been addressing financial issues since their election and installment in January. It was decided, in cooperation with the existing CPA and office staff, to make work the system we now have. Further investigation revealed the software package was not what it had been reported to be, but that an expensive \$600.00 upgrade would be required; that the CPA was not able to train the Office Staff, and that further training would be overly expensive. As per dictates of the CCFAA Bylaws, the OOC had reviewed the current accounting and reporting practices and found them wanting and not practically salvageable.

A plan of action has been adopted and is currently being carefully implemented and reviewed in preparation for a turnkey conversion from the old to the new. The 2005 body of CCFAA delegates has approved the purchase of industry standard retail accounting software in which the Office Manager and CCFAA Treasurer are already trained. The Office Manager and Systems Administrator have been working together to integrate the current budget and accounts structure into this program with expert assistance from an Applications Specialist. The Systems Administrator has long been establishing and improving an accurate database to also integrate into this program.

OOO Supplemental Report: Systems Administrator (cont'd)

As a side note, Central Office staff has found no records of registered CCFAA Member Groups and much of the contact information on record for groups in the current schedule was and remains inaccurate. All groups have been asked to reregister and submit an annual "subscription" renewal to ensure continued accuracy of the data. To date Central Office has received updates from approximately 150 of the 400 groups listed in the current schedule.

At the time of this report all saleable items have been entered into the new system. Over 400 group and individual customer profiles have been loaded into the system. An accounts and budget structure has been prepared to accept all the 2005 data. Group and Individual account numbers have been assigned and a new sales invoice form has been designed to minimize sales and contributions data entry error.

It is anticipated that by the end of June CCFAA's complete 2005 financial and inventory records will be recreated in the new QuickBooks software. At this point it is advised to make a complete, fearless and thorough inventory of all assets, inventory, and liabilities to determine exactly where CCFAA really stands financially. These data will then be compared to those reported by the new financial accounting system. It is also proposed to then adjust the 1/1/2005 year beginning data originally entered in QuickBooks to synchronize the accounting system with the actual inventory. We will then have accurate data for 2005 YTD as well as for 2004 year-end.

The 2005 Budget was written by the current Office Manager in November when she had little more than 30 days in the position and had to refer to confusing and sometimes conflicting financial reports. She finally resorted to invoices and receipts of actual transactions to make more accurate estimates. The delegates can anticipate that the 2006 budget will be even better. The 2005 budget was then submitted and reviewed by the remaining member of the OOC before being presented for delegate approval.

It is appropriate that the first draft of the budget be written by the one most intimately familiar with day to day office operations, the one who makes the day to day financial decisions. In the new system, in addition to writing the checks, the office staff will be able to make the ledger entries, assigning them to the proper accounts and budget line items. Also, current cost accounting does not reflect the actual cost of some of the saleable items and this too can be corrected in the new system. Monthly financial reports can also be generated by the Office Manager and reviewed for accuracy by the CCFAA Treasurer prior to presentation to the Delegates. As a result, CPA services need only be retained for quarterly tax preparation and annual audit at a much lesser expense than is currently being incurred.

It is suggested Delegates await the results of full implementation of the current efforts before incurring any further expense or taking any further that the action. Thank you for taking the time to review this update and proposal.

C. Treasurer - Alice J was absent: Valerie gave information regarding the written report. Line #46 is being corrected to Line #59 – was posted incorrectly. The remainder of the report was turned over to Frank, Central Office Systems Administration, who read the CCFAA 2003-2005 Financial Accounting Report.

D. By Laws & Procedures – Leon N: The committee received a written letter from Auburn Fellowship recommending changes to the By Laws. The committee will meet and report to the OOC.
