Did You Know?

Some may think that we have carried the principles of group autonomy to extremes. For example, in its original “long form,” Tradition Four declares: “Any two or three gathered together for sobriety may call themselves an A.A. group, provided that as a group they have no other affiliation.” (*This is a misquote, Bill was referring to tradition three*) This means that these two or three alcoholics could try for sobriety in any way they liked. They could disagree with any or all A.A.’s principles and still call themselves an A.A. group.

But this ultra-liberty is not as risky as it looks. In the end the innovators would have to adopt A.A. principles—at least some of them—in order to stay sober at all. If, on the other hand, they found something better than A.A., or if they were able to improve on our methods, then in all probability we would adopt what they discovered for general use everywhere. This sort of liberty also prevents A.A. from becoming a frozen set of dogmatic principles that could not be changed even when obviously wrong. Healthy trial and error always have their day and place in A.A. Of course any dissident group is urged—though never commanded—not to make any other affiliation. Obviously we could not very well have Catholic A.A. groups, Republican A.A. groups, Democratic A.A. groups, or Communist A.A. groups. Nor should any A.A. group align itself with any particular brand of medical or psychiatric treatment. We can cooperate with anyone. But the name “Alcoholics Anonymous must be reserved for us only.

Many people wonder how A.A. can function under such a seeming anarchy. Other societies have to have law and force and sanction and punishment, administered by authorized people. Happily for us, we found we need no human authority whatever. We have two authorities which are far more effective. One is benign, the other malign. There is God, our Father, who very simply says, “I am waiting for you to do my will.” The other authority is named John Barleycorn, and he says, “You had better do God’s will or I will kill you.” And sometimes he does kill. So, when the chips are down, we conform with God’s will or perish. At this level, the death sentence hangs over the A.A. member, his group, and A.A. as a whole. Therefore we have full benefits of the murderous political dictatorships of today but none of their liabilities. So there is authority enough, love enough, and punishment enough, all without any human being clutching the handles of power. Such is A.A.’s backstop against dissolution, and its final guarantee of survival under any conditions. For us it is do or die. But this is not the whole story. As our individual and group development progresses, we begin to obey the A.A. Traditions for other reasons. We begin to obey them because we think they are right for us. We obey these principles because we think they are good principles, even though we resist somewhat. Then comes the final level of obedience, the best of all. We obey A.A.’s Steps and Traditions because we really want them for ourselves. It is no longer a question of good or evil; we conform because we genuinely want to conform. Such is our process of growth in unity and in function. Such is the evidence of God’s grace and love among us.

NEVER ON TUESDAY GROUP LEETER TO THE DELEGATES

To all CCFAA Delegates:

In the April Delegates Meeting, wallet cards containing verses, prayers, and other material were introduced as being available for sale at Central Office. Sample sets were available to delegates to share with their groups. When the cards were brought to the Never On Tuesday (NOT) business meeting, several NOT members noted that the card contents were not Alcoholics Anonymous Conference-Approved Literature (CAL), and objections were raised to the sanctioning of the cards by CCFAA. The NOT delegate raised this issue at the June Delegates Meeting, where it was suggested that NOT write a letter to the CCFAA detailing the concerns. Therefore, NOT respectfully notes the following:

- The AA General Service Manual states that central offices provide services such as “Ordering, selling, and distributing AA Conference-approved literature.”
- AA Guidelines – Literature Committees quotes General Service Conference Literature Committee Advisory Actions-
“1977: It was suggested that AA groups be discouraged from selling literature not distributed by the General Service Office and the Grapevine.”

We believe that the introduction of non-CAL materials, while well intentioned, is in violation of Tradition 6 (endorsement of an outside enterprise) and Tradition 10 (having an opinion on an outside issue). If one item of non-CAL is accepted, why not the next (NA books, Hazelden materials, the Bible)? We strongly recommend that all delegates consider limiting CCFAA sales to CAL, as recommended in the AA Service Manual.

CONFERENCE-APPROVED LITERATURE (Service Manual)

“Conference-approved” — What It Means to You

The term “Conference-approved” describes written or audiovisual material approved by the Conference for publication by G.S.O. This process assures that everything in such literature is in accord with A.A. principles. Conference-approved material always deals with the recovery program of Alcoholics Anonymous or with information about the A.A. Fellowship.

The term has no relation to material not published by G.S.O. It does not imply Conference disapproval of other material about A.A. A great deal of literature helpful to alcoholics is published by others, and A.A. does not try to tell any individual member what he or she may or may not read.

Conference approval assures us that a piece of literature represents solid A.A. experience. Any Conference-approved booklet or pamphlet goes through a lengthy and painstaking process, during which a variety of A.A.s from all over the United States and Canada read and express opinions at every stage of production.

How To Tell What Is and What Is Not Conference-approved

Look for the statement on books, pamphlets and films: “This is A.A. General Service Conference-approved literature”

Not All “A.A. Literature” Is Conference-Approved

Central offices and intergroups do write and distribute pamphlets or booklets that are not Conference-approved. If such pieces meet the needs of the local membership, they may be legitimately classified as “A.A. literature.” There is no conflict between A.A. World Services, Inc. (A.A.W.S. — publishers of Conference-approved literature), and central offices or intergroups — rather they complement each other. The Conference does not disapprove of such material.

G.S.O. does develop some literature that does not have to be approved by the Conference, such as service material, Guidelines and bulletins.

Available at Most A.A. Groups

Most local A.A. groups purchase and display a representative sampling of Conference-approved pamphlets, and usually carry a supply of hardcover books. Conference-approved literature may be available at central offices and intergroups, or it may be ordered directly from G.S.O. Groups normally offer pamphlets free of charge, and the books at cost.

Copyright

Conference-approved literature is copyrighted with the Copyright Office, Library of Congress, Washington, D.C., U.S.A. To insure the continued integrity of A.A. literature, and to make sure the A.A. recovery program will not be distorted or diluted, permission to reprint must be obtained from A.A.W.S. in writing.

However, A.A. newsletters, bulletins, or meeting lists have blanket permission to use the material, providing proper credit is given to insure that the copyrights of A.A. literature are protected.
