PI WORLD SERVICES

The following is a response from World Services Public Information Group in New York regarding the Elderly brochure published at CCFAA:

"We had taken it to our weekly General Service Staff meeting here at G.S.O. for wider sharing, and there was some concern expressed about that piece, which we wanted to share with you.

Most literature coming from A.A., whether Conference-approved or not, is careful to present only the experience, strength and hope of A.A. itself. In your pamphlet, there is little about A.A., and much about aging, suggesting that A.A. has some medical expertise or expertise in the area of geriatrics.

While the information included may be very useful to the public, much of what is included appears to have come from sources outside of A.A. while giving the impression that it come from A.A. itself. For example, the pamphlet says that "This message is sponsored by your area Alcoholics Anonymous Committee for Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community," while most of the information appears to be the message of the Department of Health and Human Services. This suggests affiliation, and is educational, rather than A.A sharing.

Also, while the "Facts" included are attributed to an outside source, the "Drinking Problem or Aging" section does not clarify that the checklist is not from A.A."
