A Message From Ivo V. PI/CPC

As the Chairperson for PI/CPC, I want to thank the delegates and members of CCFAA for entrusting me with the responsibility of the committee this year. I will do my best to honor your choice.

This past year was very productive for us. We created three new brochures tailored to our area; two already approved by World Services in New York, and a third we hope to see approved soon. CCFAA can create and publish brochures in house, especially suited to our own area, for a fraction of what it costs to purchase from New York. This enables us to reach many more people at less expense. We now have a group of "Young People" available to work with the younger members in our communities. There is also a member who specializes in working with seniors.

PI/CPC, is a committee that cannot do its job and be successful without the help of the local Alcoholics Anonymous community. As we in AA know, "Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion;" and it has "...but one primary purpose-to carry its message to the alcoholic who still suffers." To do this we must be easily found and accessible throughout our communities, therefore, we need to make ourselves known. One of the ways we do this is by displaying our literature in places where others with alcohol related problems might go. This is where *you*, meaning any member willing to give a few minutes of their time once a month, can help. We need members to place literature in their local areas.

CCFAA covers a large part of our valley and foothill area; from Pollock Pines to Dixon, from Galt to Yuba City and more. As you can see, this area has many towns and cities with many miles between them. There are also a lot of people out there that can improve their lives with our help. You know your areas and the people needed to be contacted for placement of our brochures. It might be a school, a hospital, a library or another appropriate place where people gather. So, I'm suggesting that many of you can help make this committee more successful, so successful that even World Service in New York will know who we are. If you are willing to be one of those responsible "hands of AA" that will always "be there" when someone reaches out, please call or email our Central Office.
