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## **DID YOU KNOW?**

### **How Can A Sponsor Explain The A.A. Program?**

Sponsors will want to explain A.A. in the manner that each finds most natural and most likely to be clear to the newcomer at hand.

Experience shows that the newcomer usually cannot absorb the entire A.A. program in the first few months. Certainly, "little steps for tiny feet" applies here.

Many sponsors make sure to tell the new arrival that A.A. has one primary purpose – to help them both keep away from that first drink. They remind the newcomer that the First Step – recognizing that one has a problem – is a key part of recovery.

These sponsors remind the new comer that A.A. offers a *practical* program, and that it has already helped more than a million men and women. They suggest the need for openmindedness in facing alcoholism as a personal problem, and they underscore the fact that it is up to the newcomer alone to decide whether he or she is an alcoholic and whether A.A. can help. Nearly all members who work with newcomers look upon the A.A. program in terms of their own experience. They tell the new person that no one speaks for A.A. and that every member is perfectly free to arrive at an individual understanding of the program.

Some sponsors talk about the program in a more spiritual way than others do. But nearly all call attention to the source of strength to be found in "a Power greater than ourselves." Again, the sponsor points out, it is up to the newcomer to determine what that A.A. phrase means. It expresses an idea that people of many faiths – or of no particular faith – can and do accept with complete harmony.

### **How Can A Sponsor Handle An Over-dependent Newcomer?**

In the first days of sobriety, a newcomer is sometimes so bewildered and frightened – or so mentally fuzzy and physically weak – that he or she needs to be taken to each meeting and perhaps helped in making personal decisions. But such utter dependence on the sponsor, when carried past the earliest stages of recovery, often becomes damaging to both parties. It has already been pointed out that we stay sober through reliance on the A.A. program, not on any one member, so the newcomer's chances in this situation may not be very good. And the sponsor may either feel harried by constant, unreasonable demands, or feel flattered and let the ego build up dangerously.

How can this dilemma be solved without leaving the newcomer disheartened? Supposedly, the sponsor has been seeing that the newcomer meets many other A.A.s; maybe now is the time to redouble the effort, seeking out those likely to be extra congenial. If this tactful gambit fails, some sponsors have tried a direct approach, talking over the problem frankly with the newcomer. And if even this has no effect, the sponsor's best solution may be to say, firmly and kindly, that he or she will no longer be available any time the newcomer wishes – *but* will keep in touch, with an occasional friendly call.

Now it is up to the newcomer. One course is to find another sponsor. Or the newcomer may have achieved enough inner strength without realizing it, and can now go on to the next stage, substitute other kinds of A.A. friendship for sponsorship, start working the program in his or her own way, and take on personal responsibility in everyday life.

C. Office Operations Committee Chairperson – Valerie C:

Present: Valerie C. OOC Chair, Mike K., David S., and Dale M. – Delegates, William S. CCFAA Chair, Clem T. – Treasurer, Rodney C. – By-Laws Chair, Beverly C. – Office Manager, and Lisa T. – Visitor.

OOC Chair: At the request of the Spring Fling (SF) committee, the Office Manager (Beverly C.) and I attended their business meeting on March 8<sup>th</sup> to answer some questions/concerns they had. It turned out the questions/concerns they had were about a number of items previously brought to, and voted on by the delegates. The following is a condensed report of that meeting:

Most questions/concerns were about PICPC brochures that had appeared on group literature racks. We explained how these brochures were brought to the delegates by the PICPC chair and discussed at length at several meetings. We reiterated the importance of understanding the outreach efforts of the PICPC committee and that these brochures are not meant to be on the AA groups literature rack – they are intended to reach people in court houses, doctor's offices, social services, libraries, schools, senior centers, etc. We informed them about the response from AA's General Service Office (New York) on the brochure(s) and their view that each Central Office may create non-conference approved literature to meet the needs of each community it serves. This does not make the item "conference approved."

The SF Committee was under the impression that the Central Office was doing things without Delegate approval. We stressed the importance of that never happening and assured them it was most certainly not happening now. Nothing (out of the ordinary day to day business) IS DONE BY central Office without Delegate approval. The current and previous committee promised to serve the Delegates and AA community by practicing the Traditions and Spiritual Principles of the Steps to the best of our ability.

WE reviewed the steps required to make any changes to Central Office operations:

- 1) If the item(s) fall under the responsibility of the OOC, it gets brought to, discussed by, and voted on, by that committee. This decision is the OOC's group conscience and determines whether it goes out to the Delegates for further discussion and final vote. No individual on this committee decides anything – it is always the group conscience that determines the outcome.
- 2) The item is brought directly to the Delegates meeting by Committee Chairperson, voting Delegate or member of AA. The issue is discussed by the Delegates, Q&A occurs, the Delegates can decide to vote or take it back to their home groups and vote at the next meeting. Some issues take a minimum of three meetings before an item can be voted upon. Either way it's the Delegate Group Conscience that makes the decision.

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**CCFAA Delegates' Meeting Minutes March 18, 2006 (cont'd)**

**V Reports of Trusted Servants (continued)**

The SF committee also had concerns regarding the "birthday chips" in the original proposed budget for 2006. Again, we explained that this item was proposed to the OOC, discussed at length and voted on. Some members were for others were against. The majority vote, which is the OOC's group conscience, determined the item should be brought to the Delegates in the form of a line item on the proposed budget. The delegates then voted to note voted on the 2006 budget until the line item was removed.

One member of the SF committee raised the question "what if the chips had passed, then were would it all end – and what next. My only response to that was this: We have sober AA members willing to be of service in positions where decisions get made, sometimes very important decision. We are so happy someone volunteered to fill the vacancy that we forget to pass on the knowledge and information they need to do the job correctly. Where are all the Service Sponsors? How many of us have one? How many even know about service sponsorship? Having a service sponsor doesn't guarantee all the right answers (we're still alcoholics) but the chances of making informed group conscience decisions can be vastly improves with the help of someone with years of service experience to share. For instance: The importance of the minority opinion in AA – sometimes that is the voice of reason; the absolute necessity of not taking ownership (creating personal agenda) in items to be voted upon. Either it passes or it doesn't. Not always is it a matter of right vs. wrong. The importance of not taking things personally when the vote doesn't go our way. The group conscience is just that – the majority opinion – right or wrong it is not infallible to human error.
