A. CCFAA Chairperson – William S:

B. Assistant Chairperson/CNIA Liaison – Steve B:

Attended the CNIA meeting - The upcoming NCCAA conference was mentioned.

C. Office Operations Committee Chairperson – Valerie C:

1. Central Office does not purchase health benefits but pays a monthly stipend to eligible employees who may then pay for health insurance of their choice. The Office Manager receives \$365 towards insurance each month. The Office Assistant, knowing the By-Laws and Operating Procedures, has requested and received a pro-rated amount based on the number of hours worked. This totals about \$2,240 per year. While the Office Assistant is considered an outstanding employee and a valuable asset to CO, this committee would like future OOC members to remember this benefit when considering future pay increases.
2. The Postmaster has informed Central Office that we must use our Non-Profit Bulk Mail Permit name of Central California Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous. We've been using Central California Fellowship to protect the anonymity of members. This means we can no longer use/receive bulk mail pricing. New pricing is approximately \$0.11 more per item and will add between \$70 - \$120 to our postage bill each month. CO is looking into what it would take to change the name as to not include the words "Alcoholics Anonymous."
3. Central Office received numerous complaints about last names including in the By-the-Way minutes last month. CO does not under any circumstances edit minutes submitted by the CCFAA Recording Secretary or the H&I minutes. The Recording Secretary is aware of this issue and will not submit minutes with last names in the future. This is something to remember when any of us end our service positions and forget to pass along what we've learned along the way. CCFAA did not have a permanent Recording Secretary last year and this mistake, while unfortunate, is no one person's fault. Sometimes we all need to remember that we volunteers in service, mistakes are bound to happen, even with our best intentions – none of us are perfect. RULE 62...
4. Last month I reported that the new CPA was a volunteer. It was pointed out to the OOC that AA pays its own way and we should not be accepting free CPA work. In light of this, the new CPA will be paid \$35.00 per hour when his services are needed by CO. Because this line item is already close to spent the OOC may have to come to the delegates to request a line items change for Accounting Services.

Proposal 06-08 Section IV, Paragraph 4 & 5, Office Manager CCFAA Central Office:

Currently Reads:

4. The Office Manager and Staff are entitled to holidays as designed in Section III paragraph 3 of these Operating Procedures, as well as vacation, sick leave and Health Insurance. The Office Manager and Staff are also entitled to one (1) floating holiday per calendar year. If the Office Manager is absent due to illness or vacation, the Office Operations Committee may appoint a temporary Office Manager. Keeping in mind the qualifications as set forth in article VII, Section 7.01 of the CCFAA By-Laws.

5. The Office Manager and permanent staff shall be eligible to take vacation after six (6) months of employment. Vacation begins to accrue from date of hire but cannot be used the first six months. The full time staff shall accrue vacation at the rate of 8 hours per month for the first three (3) years; 10 hours per month after three (3) years; 12 hours per month after five (5) years; and 14 hours per month after ten (10) years. Vacation leave may be accrued up to a maximum of twenty (20) working days. (Full time as described as averaging 30 paid hours or more per week). Permanent staff working on less than full time basis shall accrue these benefits on a basis proportional to the hours worked. Sick leave is accrued by full time employees at the rate of 8 hours per month and the less than full time permanent staff shall accrue sick leave at 4 hours per month. Sick leave may be accrued up to a maximum of 27 days.

Change to:

4. The Office Manager and **Permanent** Staff are entitled to holidays as designed in Section III paragraph 3 of these Operating Procedures, as well as vacation, sick leave. The Office Manager and Staff are also entitled to one (1) floating holiday per calendar year. **Full time as described as averaging 32 paid hours or more per week, permanent staff working on less than full time basis shall accrue these benefits on a basis proportional to the hours worked. The Office Manager and permanent Staff working full time are entitled to Health Insurance.** If the Office Manager is absent due to illness or vacation, the Office Operations Committee may appoint a temporary Office Manager. Keeping in mind the qualifications as set forth in article VII, Section 7.01 of the CCFAA By-Laws.

5. The Office Manager and permanent staff shall be eligible to take vacation after six (6) months of employment. Vacation begins to accrue from date of hire but cannot be used the first six months. The full time staff shall accrue vacation at the rate of 8 hours per month for the first three (3) years; 10 hours per month after three (3) years; 12 hours per month after five (5) years; and 14 hours per month after ten (10) years. Vacation leave may be accrued up to a maximum of twenty (20) working days. (Full time as described as averaging 32 paid hours or more per week.). Permanent staff working on less than full time basis shall accrue these benefits on a basis proportional to the hours worked. Sick leave is accrued by full time employees at the rate of 8 hours per month and the less than full time permanent staff shall accrue sick leave at 4 hours per month. Sick leave may be accrued up to a maximum of 27 days.
