Is It Ever Too Late To Get A Sponsor?

No. An A.A. who has been in – or “around” the Fellowship for many years often finds that getting a good sponsor, talking frankly, and listening can make the whole program open up as it never did before.

Sponsorship can be the answer for the person who has been able to achieve only interludes of sobriety. Perhaps such a member has been associating with people who stay on the fringes of A.A., attend meetings casually, but have not yet truly taken the First Step. This can nourish secret reservations about one's own alcoholism. Or the member may have drifted into the company of others who slip repeatedly. Obviously, it's impossible to learn from them what they haven't learned themselves. For such a person, a sponsor with a firm grounding of sobriety in A.A. can make all the difference.

Even if we have many dry years behind us, we can often benefit by asking an A.A. friend to be our sponsor. We may have been feeling discontentment or real emotional pain because we forgot that the A.A. program offers a whole new way of life, not just freedom from alcohol. With a sponsor's help, we can use the program to the full, change our attitudes and, in the process, come to enjoy our sobriety.

B. Assistant Chairperson/CNIA Liaison – Steve B

Steve B attended the CNIA Meeting. Bridging the Gap is still forming, but not available in this area yet. There was a discussion about involvement with CCFAA and Bridging the Gap.

A Representative from Nor-Cal (Redding) was there. They have a central office similar to ours. The contact is Suzy (530)225-8955.

Winter Kitchen Table Group has not been receiving its By the Way.

(A discussion on Bridging the Gap ensued: its purpose is to bridge the gap between institutions and AA meetings, to aid soon-to-be or newly released persons with the transition.

It has existed since the mid-eighties in this area, but has not been associated or aligned with H&I, CCFAA, or PC/CPC. It is a New York approved group. There was some interest in seeing the brochures.)

C. Office Operations Committee Chairperson – Valerie C

1. The lease for Central Office is up in 2008. Moving would be expensive. The office is in need of renovation: ceiling tiles; light fixtures broken/falling; office space to be redesigned with a closed door office for the Manager; shelving is needed in the inventory rooms; a large hole in the wall by the water heater needs to be repaired (creating or adding to the mice problem); blinds are needed on West wall in back room. There is \$1,000 in the current budget for office improvements. The Office Manager wants delegate approval to start a dialog with the owner about tenant improvements and extending lease agreements. The OOC will be asking the delegates for a \$2,000 increase to the \$1,000 budget for this line item to meet immediate repair and improvement needs. If negotiations go well with the landlord, regarding new lease agreement, low rent increases, etc. the OOC will then come back to the delegates with a long-term plan to renovate Central Office.

Please note that these renovations/improvements have been needed at CO for years but there was never any money to afford them. The current prudent reserve has extra money that could be used for this purpose.

2. The Literature table staffed by the OOC and other AA members sold \$668.52 worth of literature at the NCCAA conference July 7-0.

3. A motion was made and passed to install an 800 number on a month to month basis. This number will be in area phone books, on new literature generated by CO.

4. In November 2005 the OOC Report stated "CO will begin on-line bill paying next month". The procedures require two signatures on checks to help safeguard AA money. The OOC has established that a printout of on-line payments will be generated and signed by two authorized persons and kept on file for audit purposes.

D. Treasurer – Clem T (Absent)

William said we have money, read the report.

E. By-Laws & Operating Procedures Chairperson – Rodney C

I didn't mail out copies of the Personnel Policy or the Delegates Handbook with the monthly By-The-Way due to the By-Laws/Procedures statement of only the amendments to those documents are required to be mailed in the By-The-Way. The committee has had two meetings this past month and plan to meet next Wednesday, July 19, at 1:30 pm. The OOC was to have a reading of the By-Laws/Procedures at the last OOC meeting but due to the time frame was unable to. Today there is to be a vote on 08-06 and discussion of 09-06 and 10-06.

William read Ivo's report: Please forgive me for not being with you today as an every 5 year roundup of my wife's family is also this Saturday. We did not have a committee meeting this month because of the holiday and many of our members were on vacation. That does not mean that we aren't keeping busy. Kaiser Hospital was serviced in Roseville, The Mercy Hospital in Carmichael was serviced, the library in Citrus Heights was added to our literature locations, as well as checking several established locations. Chuck met with a doctor that has been successful in getting legislation passed for the state whereas DUI offenders on their second offense must attend a special court that we are supplying a 4 slot rack that will hold "Making A Start In AA, our Young People's flyer, our Court flyer, and the CCFAA Schedule." About a year ago this doctor lost his only son to a drunk driver. Again, it took a tragic personal experience to make some headway in helping to reduce drunk driving. (We will do our part.) 1.) William read Proposal 08-06, Operating Procedures Section IV, Paragraph 4 & 5, Office Manager of CCFAA Central Office:

Currently Reads:

4. The Office Manager and Staff are entitled to holidays as designed in Section III paragraph 3 of these Operating Procedures, as well as vacation, sick leave and Health Insurance. The Office Manager and Staff are also entitled to one (1) floating holiday per calendar year. If the Office Manager is absent due to illness or vacation, the Office Operations Committee may appoint a temporary Office Manager. Keeping in mind the qualifications as set forth in article VII, Section 7.01 of the CCFAA By-Laws.

5. The Office Manager and permanent staff shall be eligible to take vacation after six (6) months of employment. Vacation begins to accrue from date of hire but cannot be used the first six months. The full time staff shall accrue vacation at the rate of 8 hours per month for the first three (3) years; 10 hours per month after three (3) years; 12 hours per month after five (5) years; and 14 hours per month after ten (10) years. Vacation leave may be accrued up to a maximum of twenty (20) working days. (Full time as described as averaging 30 paid hours or more a week). Permanent staff working less than full time basis shall accrue these benefits on a basis proportional to the hours worked. Sick leave is accrued by full time employees at the rate of 8 hours per month and less than full time permanent staff shall accrue sick leave at 4 hours per month. Sick leave may be accrued up to a maximum of 27 days.

Change to:

4. The Office Manager and **Permanent** Staff are entitled to holidays as designed in Section III paragraph 3 of these Operating Procedures, as well as vacation, sick leave. The Office Manager and Staff are also entitled to one (1) floating holiday per calendar year. **Full time as described as averaging 32 paid hours of more per week, permanent staff working on less than full time basis shall accrue these benefits proportional to the hours worked. The Office Manager and permanent Staff working full time are entitled to Health Insurance.** If the Office Manager is absent due to illness or vacation, the Office Operating Committee may appoint a temporary Office Manager. Keeping in mind the qualifications as set forth in article VII, Section 7.01 of the CCFAA By-Laws.

5. The Office Manager and permanent staff shall be eligible to take vacation after six (6) months of employment. Vacation begins to accrue from the date of hire but cannot be used the first six months.

CCFAA Delegates' Meeting Minutes July 15, 2006 (cont'd)

The full time staff shall accrue vacation at the rate of 8 hours per month for the first three (3) years; 10 hours per month after three (3) years; 12 hours per month after five (5) years; and 14 hours per month after ten (10) years. Vacation leave may be accrued up to a maximum of twenty (20) working days. (Full time as described as averaging **32** paid hours or more per week). Permanent staff working on less than full time basis shall accrue these benefits proportional to the hours worked. Sick leave is accrued by full time employees at the rate of 8 hours per month and the less than full time permanent staff shall accrue sick leave at 4 hours per month. Sick leave may be accrued up to a maximum of 27 days.

Reason: To remove any questions of benefits for the office staff.

All made a motion to accept, Mike seconded, the motion passed.

- 2.) Johnny D (sub for Sue H) distributed pre-sale raffle ticket packets to those interested. See Picnic Chair report.
- 3.) PI/CPC has requested an increase in budget by \$1,000 for literature for schools, libraries, etc. There is money available. A motion was made for approval, seconded and passed.

VIII NEW BUSINESS:

- 1.) Jan P was nominated and elected to fill the remaining term of the Special Needs Chair.
(She did request any information that Camille may have be forwarded to her.)
- 2.) The Central Office has requested an additional \$2,000 for tenant improvements. This amount could be transferred from another area of the budget. Bev wanted the OOC to check with the Delegates before starting the process. Urgent needs include the hole in wall, window covering and light fixtures for back room, and air conditioner.
