My personal experience was in November 2005 when I fell 10 feet from the attic of our home due to the ladder slipping away from my feet. Ladies of my home group came with food, telephone calls and a meeting to keep me from any "self-pity trip" or any thoughts of drinking. They had wonderful suggestions as to how to get around the house until I obtained a wheel chair, and giving other ideas with my temporary "setup" in the home I am fortunate to have a husband in recovery who helped me immensely with getting around and doing other household chores I would have usually done.

There is a very special bonding that occurs with members of the fellowship at a time when someone cannot make it to a meeting and really needs recovering people to come and talk of program and have a meeting in other than our typical locations where we attend meetings. Hopefully, you have had this experience of meeting someone who could not make it to a meeting due to unfortunate or limiting circumstances and would like to give back in someway. The only requirement is that you are a member of Alcoholics Anonymous and your own story of recovery to help another fellow alcoholic.
