MANAGER'S CONFERENCE REPORT

OK ladies and gents here's what happened in Akron.

It was a two story hotel with no elevator, and it was downhill from there. The workshops had some great topics. I have ordered a set of CD'S of all the workshops to be sent here. So when they come in anyone can come down here and listen to them.

One of the workshops I went to was about pricing literature: There were 7 offices out of 35 represented that did not sell "drunk-junk", such as chips, bumper stickers, b'day cards, etc. Some of the central offices sell books for the same price as listed in the catalog that comes from AAWS and some sell books 20-30% over cost, it depends on the area. Santa Barbara sells their big book for \$6.50; Indiana sells all of the books at 20% over listed price and 25 cents over cost on all pamphlets less than 45 cents. New York Central Office sells the big book for 6.00 and their schedules for 1.50. There was a lot of discussion about the price of schedules. Some give them away but most charge for them. Printing in house is less expensive than having them done by a printer.

Everybody has problems with group updates, meetings that have moved, closed up, changed time etc. One man said he went to an AA meeting that was listed as *closed* in the schedule but the members let a non-alcoholic share. He said that was the way those at the meeting wanted it so he went back to the central office and changed the meeting description to *open*. I wonder if that would work here.

The offices that don't sell chips, etc., are the ones who have more than 50% of their income from group contributions, the other offices have to sell the "drunk-junk" to keep the doors open. The groups in our area support this office, for which I am grateful. Another workshop I went to was about fund raisers. My, oh my! What discussions we had. Cleveland, Ohio, has pledge slips they hand out to the groups the first of each year. The groups pledge the amount of money they will send central office each year. Three times a year the central office sends reminder letters that their amount is due. I'm not sure that would work here but it does in Cleveland (my home town). Milwaukee puts out a gratitude box every November. Last year they got \$16k from their groups, and they said that it did not impact their monthly contributions. Indianapolis says they no longer have raffles, as there is too much red tape with the state and too much controversy with the groups around traditions. North Carolina has two breakfasts a year plus a Christmas dance and picnic. Youngstown has a Spaghetti Dinner with an auction and asks groups to put together some type of "basket" for a raffle. Attendees purchase tickets and place them in whatever basket they want. All proceeds from the dinner and raffle go to central office.

Next year the conference will be in Oklahoma City October 4th thru the 7th and in 2008 it will be held in Edmonton Canada. I went to the oldest meeting in AA history, in Akron, on Wednesday night. It was a speaker meeting and when the meeting was over everybody got up and said the closing prayer, no chanting about keep coming back, just Amen and that was it. It's nice to know I'm not the only one who doesn't chant.

I bought some literature at the Akron central office that was "pre conference approved" but it got "lost." I will try to get more from them next month. Lots of good stuff about old time AA!

Thank you to the delegates who agreed to let me attend. Some of the central office managers were not there due to the lack of enough money to send the office manager.

There will be an Open House and Year-End Celebration for all the volunteers in December. Please come down and see what your CCFAA Central Office does and how it would not operate without all of the volunteers. The date will be December 2nd from 11:00am 'til 3:00pm. Bring a side dish. A plate of brownies would even be better! (No nuts, please.)

Anybody out there who can help the office with carpet cleaning? If you can help please call the office, it would be done on a Saturday.

**(Old or Existing) ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF
THE CENTRAL CALIFORNIA FELLOWSHIP OF
ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS**

FIRST: The name of this Corporation is Central California Fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous (CCFAA).

SECOND:

- a) The specific and primary purpose for which this Corporation is organized and operated is to aid, assist, counsel and, in every manner, expedite and facilitate the rehabilitation of persons who are victims of the illness, *alcoholism*, to establish, maintain and administer a service organization for the benefit of its members and to promote the general welfare of such fellowship through a centrally located office.
- b) The general purpose for which this Corporation is formed is to erect, construct, purchase, own, lease, rent, maintain, repair and operate offices and buildings in furtherance of specific and primary purpose as set forth in paragraph (a) hereof.
- c) This Corporation shall have and exercise all rights and powers conferred on Corporations under the laws of the State of California, provided, however, that this Corporation is not empowered to engage in any activity which in itself is not in furtherance of its purposes as set forth in paragraphs (a) and (b) of this Article SECOND.
- d) This Corporation shall not, as a substantial part of its activities, carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation. This Corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

THIRD: This Corporation is organized pursuant to the General Nonprofit Corporation Law of the State of California.

FOURTH: The County of the State of California where the principal office for the transaction of the business of this Corporation is to be located is the County of Sacramento.

FIFTH:

- (a) The powers of this Corporation shall be exercised, its properties controlled, and its affairs conducted by a Board of Directors. The number of directors of this Corporation shall be five (5). The number of directors herein provided may be changed by a By-Law duly adopted by the members entitled to vote.
- (b) The names and addresses of the persons who are appointed to act as the first directors are:

SIXTH: The authorized number and qualifications of the members of this Corporation, the class of membership, the property, the voting and other rights and privileges of members, and the liability of members to dues or assessments and the method of collection thereof shall be set forth in the By-Laws of this Corporation.

SEVENTH: This Corporation is one that does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit to the members thereof, and it is organized solely for nonprofit purposes. Upon the winding up and dissolution of this Corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the Corporation, the remaining assets shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or Corporation, which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious and/or scientific purposes and which established its tax-exempt status under Section 501 © (3) of the Internal Revenue Code. If this Corporation holds any assets in trust, such assets shall be disposed in such manner as may be directed by decree of the Superior Court of the County of Sacramento, State of California, upon petition therefore by the Attorney General or by any person concerned in the liquidation.

 - C. OOC Chair- Valerie (absent) reported that the committee met and discussed items for new business. She also went to the Central office Conference in Akron in September with Beverly. Akron Central office has an archive museum with items dating back to the Oxford Group and they publish a lot of their own material. She will bring some of the pre-conference material to the December meeting. Almost all central offices have their own printed material as we do, so we seem to be in line with the rest of AA.

E. 2007 Budget- John brought up that his group discussed removing NCCAA delegate reimbursement from the budget and they are against this.
