PI/CPC Committee Meeting December 13, 2006 Meeting was called to order at 7:10 PM by Ivo V., Chairman

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

YOUNG PEOPLES REPORT: Aaron, and Dane.

The Young People's committee did not meet this month. They continue to work on the young people's brochure. The content is complete but the committee is eliminating the photos and replacing them with a type of graphics yet to be determined. They will have the final draft ready for the January meeting.

OLDER ADULT REPORT: Maurine

97 Older Adult brochures with cover letter have been mailed out this year. (The variety of recipients was outlined in Maurine's annual report.) This is an on-going process. An investigation is being made into the newly discovered groups, in other areas of the country, specifically for alcoholics 60 years and older. These groups are known as "Sober Over Sixty" (SOS) that had their first national conference in Hawaii in May of this year and plan their second in the spring of 2007. She will look into what part they play in AA if any.

Kelley has been investigating what other districts are doing in relation to getting AA meetings and other notices into local newspapers. He proposed that the PI/CPC committee investigate putting our AA hotline phone number in community newspapers in the CCFAA area. He agreed to chair this project. The committee approved.

Also approved for 2007 was the printing of business size cards with AA's hotline number to be disbursed throughout the community where appropriate, ie, hotels, motels, etc. He also reported that a bay area PI committee had conducted a session for judges in their community. Our committee agreed to follow-up on possible duplication in our area.

Jim: Reported that he has been working with the Communication Workers of America Union #7941 (CWA) and has placed literature in the Union Hall.

  - B. Line item #6 – CCFAA Committees – 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition
  - C. Line item #77 – Group Contributions – Short Fall – Accountability.

#### BUDGET 2007 – LINE ITEM #66 – Management Salary

History: OCTOBER 2004 – Hired Current Office Manager – Salary \$2800.00 a month  
SEPTEMBER 2005 – Delegates approved a 10% increase - \$3080.00 a month  
SEPTEMBER 2006 – OOC approved a 5% increase retroactive to MAY 2006 without delegate approval because the OOC Chairperson stated the money was already in the budget so they could.  
OCTOBER 2006 - one-time \$2000 bonus was approved for the Office Manager in with a statement that “the Office Manager had not had a raise since September 2005. There was a “raise” in September 2006. Surplus \$2000 due to Budget Line Item being \$41,000. CURRENT SALARY 3234.00 a month

THEREFORE: 2004 Actual Salary \$33,600 – Budgeted at \$32,240  
2005 Actual Salary \$36,960 (10% increase from 2004)  
2006 Actual Salary \$38,808 (9.5% increase from 2005) – Budgeted at \$41,000  
2007 Proposed Salary \$43,500 (ANOTHER 9% increase)

Total Actual Salary Increases since hire 19.5% with implied 9% increase in 2007 brings total raises of 28.5% in 3 years.  
Discussion: The Handout by the OOC regarding comparable salaries to State of California personnel salaries as a median calculator is null and void. The “State Civil Service Process” is rigorous and is established for a career position. It entails application, testing, written and oral, passing grades, eligibility placement, and then highly competitive interviewing. The minimum qualifications have to be met to even qualify to take an examination. The Central Office Manager position has NEVER been compared to State salaries and duties. This is a “special worker” job in a non-profit corporation. Therefore, the information given for comparison with similar duties and none of the management responsibilities to justify the “below standard pay” statement by this committee is misleading, erroneous and absurd. Only State employee Holidays were taken into account WHEN the Central Office was located in a building where State employees were housed.

### VII New Business: (cont'd)

Dorian G. from Big Book Uncovered presented the following on the 2007 budget:

Discussion (cont'd): There is no problem with increases in salaries when justified and reasonable. However, an increase of over 20% in 3 years' time is excessive. Since the money comes from the individual members it is imperative that they be informed and able to provide feedback to their delegates. Putting it down as a line item in the budget implies it was already reviewed, discussed, and decided

Proposed: The Big Book Uncovered Group proposes that the 2007 Budget Line Item #66 – Management Salary be adjusted in keeping with "Actual Salary" of \$38,808. In this way, any future changes in the Office Manager Salary will need to be done per Operating Procedures and By-Laws of the CCF. This will ensure the CCFAA membership is well informed in advance, allow for the opportunity of discussion including the minority opinion (per the Twelve Concepts), and guarantee accountability by verification of proposed facts.

### **BUDGET LINE ITEM #6 – CCFAA Committees – 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition**

Background: It is a tradition that when AA Committees meet they observe the 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition and take a monetary collection. This has been the case with CCFAA Committees as is reflected in the various Committee Reports and, subsequently, in the Budget. Recent examples in the December By-the-Way, *CCFAA Delegate's Meeting Minutes*, are: "7<sup>th</sup> Tradition, Collected \$60.95" (p.10), "7<sup>th</sup> tradition - \$7.00" (p.11 – OOC).

Operating Procedures, Section XVII (17.1) notes "Intergroup Committee (Delegates)" thus making it clear that our monthly delegates meeting is a 'committee' too.

Discussion: There is no record of a vote by the delegates to 'zero out' this line item in the 2007 Budget. The 2006 budgeted amount was \$600. As of October 2006 actual collected amount was \$49. Add in the \$67.95 collected in November and the current total is \$116.95. There has been no explanation submitted by the Treasurer as to why Line Item #6 is 'zero'.

Proposed: The Big Book Uncovered Group proposes that the 2007 Budget Line Item #6 – CCFAA Committees – 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition be given a monetary amount. The amount should be determined as a result of an accounting and averaging of past actual amounts for this line item being presented to the Delegates.

### **BUDGET 2007 – LINE ITEM #77 – Group Contributions**

Background: The individual AA member attending a meeting contributes to the 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition by putting money in the hat/basket. That AA member is acting in 'good faith and trust' that the money collected will be used as stated in AA tradition "self-support, bills, maintenance" etc. AA Groups that comprise the Central California Fellowship (CCF) then decide to contribute a portion of the 7<sup>th</sup> Tradition collection to the CCF in 'good faith and trust' that the money will be used appropriately for operating our Central Office. History has shown us that some AA Groups lose that faith and trust and will withhold contribution to CCF until problems are corrected. Other AA Groups barely take in enough to pay their own way and cannot contribute to CCF. Additionally, there are times when relatively large one-time amounts are contributed to CCF by AA Conference Committees. In sum, the Group Contributions to CCF fluctuate.

Discussion: 2005 Budgeted Amount was \$100,000 – Actual Contributions were \$75,000

2006 Budgeted Amount was \$98,200 – Actual Contributions to Nov. are \$75,625

2007 Proposed Amount is \$99,540

An accounting and averaging of the monthly contributions in 2006 shows an average total of \$7000 per month.

Add \$14,000 projected for November and December to the \$75,600 and the projected Actual Contributions for 2006 would be \$89,600. That amount is under the 2006 Budgeted Amount by \$8,600. All things considered, using a projected average of \$8000 per month to be contributed in 2007, the total would be \$96,000.

Proposed: The Big Book Uncovered Group proposes that the 2007 Budget Line Item #77 – be reduced to \$98,000 (an amount in keeping with accounting and averaging of past amounts and allowing for one-time contributions).

2.) Responsibilities of CCFAA Trusted Servants to the Fellowship – To Lead and not Govern.

3.) Attendance – Operating Procedures

4.) Informing new Delegates – Operating Procedures

The question was asked – Aren't you auditing the budget, because a budget is just an estimate? Big Book Uncovered has looked at the budget and these three line items have them concerned. Per operating procedures, "Any line item can be changed within a certain period of time after the budget as a whole has been passed."

The next CCFAA meeting is January 20, 2007 at 3:00 pm at Traditional – 2703 El Camino @ Fulton, Sacramento.

New delegates are to arrive @ 2:00 p.m. for orientation and to register.

Motion was made, seconded and approved to close the meeting. The meeting closed at 4:45 p.m. with The Lord's Prayer.
