The information above is presented for your information because of the significant change experienced in 2006. Central Office appreciates all the support given this past year, but the march goes on and we will need your continued support even more in 2007.

THE SKY IS FALLING, THE SKY IS FALLING!

The Delegates of 2006 approved whatever expenditure was necessary to address the heating and air conditioning problems encountered at Central Office, however it seems that our heat pump though not new is working as well as can be expected. Nevertheless the office is too cold in winter and too warm in summer. A review of the situation revealed the major problem to be the lack of insulation above the ceilings. There is absolutely no insulation anywhere above our ceilings at Central Office. Before insulation can be added the ceilings themselves must be repaired. They currently consist of old weathered, water-stained acoustic tiling, much of which is regularly falling from the ceiling to the floors. Estimates for the replacement of the ceiling materials with drywall sheeting are being obtained and a report of the full repair costs will be presented at the next Delegate's meeting.

TeleService Needs Us

TeleService is the AA Hotline when the Central Office is closed. Nearly 90% of the calls we receive are from people searching for a meeting or requesting information about AA. The remaining calls are from people reaching out for help for themselves, a family member or friend. This valuable service is run by volunteers with at least 6 months of sobriety. We are in need of dependable people willing to work a 4-6 hour shift once each week for a 6-month commitment. Substitute shift workers are available when needed. Service can be done from your home or cell phone. Anonymity is the spiritual foundation of all our traditions.

TeleService will always need dependable, committed folks who can be available for 12-step work. When the hotline receives a call from someone reaching out, it is essential that we are there to help. TeleService uses a *12-step call list* of men and women willing to answer the call of another alcoholic in need. By adding yourself to this list, you give the Hotline one more option for helping our fellows. This is an easy and effective way to give back to the program that has been so freely given to us. Please consider volunteering for our *12-step call list*.

- a) OP 8.11.14 states "the Office Manager shall publish the Agenda for all Delegates meetings." and, "the content and order of the Agenda shall be the responsibility of the CCFAA Chairperson." This has not been getting done. The Agenda that I am pointing out is the 'following month's agenda' which has always been published in the By-the-Way on the page preceding the "Minutes of Delegates Meeting". Don't know why it's been missing for awhile now. It gives the delegates a heads-up and reminder for the next month's meeting as well as the fellowship at large. Old Business is already known and can be included, some New Business may be known in time for submission.
- b) Findings: I spoke with Rodney, the past by-laws chair and he informed me that this was stopped some time ago probably around 1994. If past By-The-Ways were checked it would be discovered that the "following month's agenda" has not appeared in the by-the-way for quite some time. Frank answered and this is a summarized conclusion to his great detail of answer. 10% increase per year to help keep manager compensated for high work load required. The salary does not stand up to the amount of work required by the manager. This view on the subject is derived from equivalent job studies and the current pay scale for similar jobs. CURRENT

11.4 A Quorum of twenty (20) percent of the registered Delegates is required to conduct any Delegate or Special meetings. In the event a quorum is not present, no vote shall be taken on any matter before the Delegates. (Rev. 10/06)

11.8 The Recording Secretary shall purge the Delegates' Active Roster to remove the name of any Delegate who has not attended a Delegates' meeting in the preceding twelve (12) months. (Rev. 10/06)

PROPOSED

11.4 A Quorum of twenty (20) percent of the ~~registered Delegates~~ Delegates' Active Roster is required to conduct any Delegate or Special meetings. In the event a quorum is not present, no vote shall be taken on any matter before the Delegates. (Rev. 03/07)

11.8 The ~~Recording Secretary~~ Central Office shall purge the Delegates' Active Roster to remove the name of any ~~Delegate who has not attended~~ Group/Delegate which has not been represented by their Delegate of record or designated alternate at a Delegates' meeting in the preceding twelve (12) months. (Rev. 03/07)

The proposed change reflects current practice at the CCFAA Delegates' Monthly business meetings. This practice has been the norm since its inception at least 4 years ago.

As paragraph 11.4 currently reads, a quorum would require the attendance of 20% of the approximately 385 member groups. Each group is represented by a Delegate at their inception as a CCFAA member group. Unless the group elects a new Delegate the record does not change and the member status of the Group remains one of good standing. Therefore the quorum requirement would always be approximately 77 attending Delegates. As such quorum requirements would rarely be met.
