##### Office Manager's report:

- 1) Beverly submitted the March 2007 CCFAA Treasurer's report. There was nothing to note other than the unanticipated low Group Contribution line item for the month of March. Discussion of this shortfall followed and it was agreed that mention of "Break the Buck" barrier to the Delegate body might be appropriate!
- 2) The new General Liability insurance policy annual premium has been paid.
- 3) The vacancy, previously reported, of the Friday pm phone shift at Central Office has been filled.
- 4) There has been no response from the Landlord regarding the proposed repairs as of today.
- 5) The telephone company representative has yet to respond to inquiries regarding an 800 phone number.

##### OOB Chairperson's report:

- 1) The feasibility of installing an 800 telephone line at the Central Office was discussed at length. The OOB and the Teleservice Chairperson, (AL E.) agreed that, due to an improved web-site and an increased number of contact numbers available in the northern California region, the implementation of an 800 number would not be prudent at this time.
