RATIONALE:

The proposed change simplifies current accounting practices to eliminate errors when booking and accounting receivables. In essence each budget line can be viewed as a separate fund and these are reported monthly in the treasurer's report. With the exception of AAWS Literature and the Special Events they are all managed from the General fund. All excess monies in the Literature fund and the Special Events Fund are routinely transferred to the General fund and therefore these funds serve no real purpose. Separating all funds received into three groups when preparing deposits is a lengthy and tedious process often requiring two persons and is the cause of numerous accounting errors. Our CPA whole heartedly agrees that elimination of these unnecessary funds would be a step in the right direction.

The new bank account structure would include:

- A General Fund (checking account) which we currently have.
- A linked Savings account, which would yield an interest return which the three current checking accounts do not, and would hold the bulk of operational funds required to cover literature purchases and special event funding. For example the Special Events Fund holds \$5000.00 all year and returns no interest.
- Certificates of deposit which would hold the bulk of the prudent reserve funds and yield a somewhat higher interest than the savings account.

A.A. and Alcoholism

A.A. experience has always been made available freely to all who sought it – business people, spiritual leaders, civic groups, law enforcement officers, health and welfare personnel, educators, representatives of military establishments, institutional authorities, representatives of organized labor, and many others. But A.A. never endorses, supports, becomes affiliated with, or expresses an opinion on the programs of others in the field of alcoholism, since such actions would be beyond the scope of the Fellowship's primary purpose.

A.A.'s relations with professional groups, agencies, facilities, and individuals involved with the problems of alcoholism are handled by the trustees' Committee on Cooperation with the Professional Community. Mutual understanding and cooperation between A.A. members and others who work with alcoholics are the concerns of this standing committee of the General Service Board.
