CONCERN:

The Concepts assist with ensuring that all CCFAA Delegates can either take any new actions to their Group for discussion before voting on said action or can act as the Group Representative to be sure that Group concerns are addressed.
3. To ensure that the CCFAA Delegates will be informed of proposed actions by the Standing Committees and Chairpersons that affect the AA Community as a whole. This provides for Group Representation before taking the action.

The Concepts assist with ensuring that all CCFAA Delegates can either take any new actions to their Group for discussion before voting on said action or can act as the Group Representative to be sure that Group concerns are addressed.
3. To ensure that the CCFAA Delegates will be informed of proposed actions by the Standing Committees and Chairpersons that affects the AA Community as a whole. In particular, letters literature (not previously approved) or any other materials publicly distributed should be discussed and approved by the Delegates because those documents represent all of our Groups collectively. This provides for Group Representation before taking the action.

Listed below are the Twelve Concepts Numbers I and IV:

1. Concept I – Final responsibility and ultimate authority for AA World Service (Intergroup is apart of) should always reside in the collective conscience of our whole Fellowship.
2. Concept IV – At all responsible levels, we are to maintain a “Right of Participation” allowing a voting representation in reasonable proportion to the responsibility that each must discharge
