Oklahoma City Trip

There were 166 office managers from Canada and the U.S. there. We had 36 new ones; that's a lot in one year so for some it was quite the big adventure. The workshops started at 8am on Friday. For me, that's when the policy committee meeting was. I'm on the policy committee for the next year for this seminar.

The next workshop was at 10:00 am. I went to the one on newsletters. The other two were on prudent reserve and volunteers. Our office is above average on both of those. One item discussed was making sure that where we use bulk mail, no flyer go out that requests money be sent anywhere but to central office. We could lose our permit if we send out flyers for anything outside of AA. Some offices only print newsletters every couple of months and a lot of offices have committees that review the newsletter before it gets mailed. In these offices the manager is not the editor. Some of the offices also have outside printers that put the paper together, which costs more than in house printing. One central office only mails the newsletter to contributing groups, if the group doesn't support the office they don't get the newsletter. A couple of the offices don't put the financials in the letter. If a group wants a copy of the treasurer's report they have to go to the inter-group business meeting or come into the office. The reason is the paper is on the web and they are not comfortable with all the info being out there. All last names and phone numbers are taken out of all reports before being put on the web. Tradition 11, press is press.

I went to more workshops on email and 12 step lists, policies and procedures and I chaired a workshop on insurance. If you want to hear any of the workshops come into the office and you can listen to the CD'S. I bought a whole set of them, can't take them out of the office but you are more than welcome to listen to them here.

The next seminar will be in Edmonton Canada. It would be nice to attend that one but there is some concern on my part. Last time we had the seminar there I got stuck and had to ride Greyhound bus for many days to get back home. The date was September 11th, 2001. In the year 2009 the seminar will be in Rochester, New York. Cities bid two years out to give more central offices a chance at hosting the seminar.

Thank you to all members of CCFAA for giving me the opportunity to attend.
