DID YOU KNOW?

The Importance of Anonymity

From A.A. Fact File, prepared and published by General Service Office of Alcoholics Anonymous

Traditionally, A.A. members have always taken care to preserve their anonymity at the "public" level: press, radio, television, and films.

In the early days of A.A., when more stigma was attached to the term "alcoholic" than is the case today, this reluctance to be identified - and publicized - was easy to understand.

As the fellowship of A.A. grew, the positive values of anonymity soon became apparent.

First, we know from experience that many problem drinkers might hesitate to turn to A.A. for help if they thought their problem might be discussed publicly, even inadvertently, by others. Newcomers should be able to seek help with assurance that their identities will not be disclosed to anyone outside the Fellowship.

Then, too, we believe that the concept of personal anonymity has a spiritual significance for us - that it discourages the drives for personal recognition, power, prestige, or profit that have caused difficulties in some societies. Much of our relative effectiveness in working with alcoholics might be impaired if we sought or accepted public recognition.

While each member of A.A. is free to make his or her own interpretations of A.A. tradition, no individual member is ever recognized as a spokesperson for the Fellowship locally, nationally, or internationally. Each member speaks only for himself or herself.

A.A. is indebted to all media for their assistance in strengthening the Tradition of anonymity over the years. From time to time, the General Service Office contacts all major media in the United States and Canada, describing the Tradition and asking for cooperation in its observance.

An A.A. member may, for various reasons, "break anonymity" deliberately at the public level. Since this is a matter of individual choice and conscience, the Fellowship as a whole obviously has no control over such deviations from tradition. It is clear, however, that such individuals do not have the approval of the overwhelming majority of members.

MUTUAL SHARING

Grapevine, January 1987

About a year ago I was asked to share my experience, strength, and hope with a local young people's group. The bulk of its members are under twenty-one and most are dually addicted. Although many of them have less than one year in the Fellowship, most of them exhibit a good, working, practical approach to our "program of recovery."

The language left something to be desired, though. It was liberally laced with various four-letter words, many depicting normal bodily functions. One young lady, fifteen or sixteen years old, spoke near the end of the meeting. She peppered her comments with words that would have made a mule-skinner blush. It took this fifty-five year old more by dismay than shock. She looked like a sweet young thing, and sounded like the legendary Calamity Jane.

Following the meeting, I had the opportunity to talk with our budding Calamity. I suggested that she had many things going for her in sobriety and asked why she insisted on using such foul language. I passed on to her a thought given to me more than forty years ago: "Profanity is a product of a lazy mind." Her response to this thought was to tell me just where to put it (and not so gently, I might add).

I didn't see Calamity for about four months since we normally don't attend the same meetings. One night, out of the blue, she attended my home group. When she talked it was hard to believe it was the same young lady. You could see and hear an additional four months growth in her. Her language was almost spotless.

Following the meetings, we again talked. She thanked me for helping her to open her ears to what she'd been saying and how she'd been saying it. She made an amends she felt was necessary, as I made one to her. The smile on her face, the sparkle in her eyes, and the enthusiasm in her voice proved again to this alcoholic that it is through our mutual sharing of ideas and experiences the young learn from the old, and, maybe more importantly, the old learn from the young.
