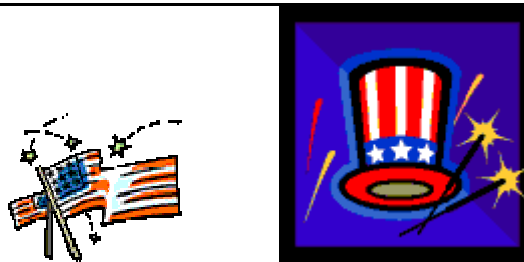

Income

- Income for April was on target based on budget projections.. Most income items met or exceeded budget year to date.
- The income primarily consists of ----
 - o AAWS literature sales; \$7,947.41 actual vs. \$7,625 projected.
 - o Group contributions were \$9,525.41 actual vs. \$8,416 projected.
 - o Birthday contributions and Office Services revenue both exceeded projection.
