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Step Eleven

Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God, as we understood Him, praying only for the knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.

Tradition Eleven

Our public relations policy is base on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and films.

Concept Eleven

While the trustees hold final responsibility for A.A.'s world service administration, they should always have the assistance of the best possible standing committees, corporate service directors, executives, staffs, and consultants. Therefore the composition of these underlying committees and service boards, the personal qualifications of their members, the manner of their induction into service, the systems of their rotation, the way in which they are related to each other, the special rights and duties of our executive, staffs and consultants, together with a proper basis for the financial compensation of these special workers, will always be matters for serious care and concern.

ARTICLE XV ELECTIONS

Section 15.01 Recruiting Committee

- (a). The Chairperson shall, at the regularly scheduled Delegates meeting in August, select a Recruiting Committee, consisting of four Delegates and three members at large. This committee is subject to approval by the Delegates at the regularly scheduled Delegates meeting in September.
- (b). Geographic diversity among appointment is recommended. It is also recommended that the Chairperson consider appointing at large members with a considerable length of sobriety and service experience, including service in CCFAA
- (c). The purpose of the Recruiting Committee is to encourage qualified members of groups within CCFAA to make themselves available for CCFAA officer and committee chairpersons at the annual CCFAA elections.

Section 15.02. Election Chair. The Chairperson has the option of serving as the Election Chair or of selecting another person with experience in the Third Legacy Procedure to act as Election Chair.

Section 15.03. Eligibility for election. All people present shall be eligible for election to any position for which they are qualified on the date of the election. The qualifications are set out separately for each elected position in these By-Laws

- (a) All candidates must normally be present to be eligible for election. However, the Delegates, by a majority vote, may allow an absent candidate to be available for election in unusual circumstances (such as a family or employment emergency).

Section 15.04 Resumes. Prior to the election, candidates should submit a written resume detailing their home group, sobriety date, and their service experience in Alcoholics Anonymous.

Section 15.05 The procedure for the election of all elected positions at the November meeting shall be the Third Legacy Procedure, as follows:

- (a). The election chairperson shall poll each person present to determine whether they are available to serve in any position.
- (b). A 15 minute break shall be called by the Election Chair prior to the election to allow for the preparation of a resume by those who have not previously done so.
- (c). Each candidate's name (suggest full names be used) is written on a blackboard in front of the room. As each name is written, the candidate shall stand as their resume is read.
- (d). The Election Chair then polls each candidate to determine whether they are available for the position being elected. The names of the unavailable candidates shall be erased from the blackboard.
- (e). Paper and pencils are distributed for written ballots.
- (f). The voting members are the Delegates. The secretary calls the roll of the Delegates present to determine the total number of eligible voters.
- (g). Two non-voting persons are selected as tellers, two non-voting members are selected as collectors of ballots, and one non-voting person is selected to record the tallied votes on the blackboard. These people must not be standing for office and should not be presently serving in any CCFAA elected position.
- (h). The Delegates present cast written ballots. The ballots are then collected and given to the tellers to count. Votes will be written on the blackboard alongside the names of the candidates.

ARTICLE XV ELECTIONS (continued)

Section 15.05 (continued)

- (i). The first candidate to receive two-thirds (2/3) of the vote is elected.
- (j). After the second ballot (assuming no candidate received the necessary two-thirds (2/3) on the first ballot), and candidate having less than one-fifth (1/5) of the total vote, will be drawn automatically, except that the two top candidates must remain. (In case there are ties for second place, the top candidate and tied second place candidates remain.)
- (k). After the third ballot, candidates with less than one-third of the total vote will be withdrawn automatically, except the two top candidates must remain. (In case there are ties for second place, the top candidate and tied second place candidates remain.)
- (l). After the fourth ballot, if no candidate has two-thirds of the vote total, the Election Chair asks for a motion, second, and majority of hands on conducting a fifth and final ballot. If this motion is defeated, balloting is over and we go to the "hat" immediately. (The candidate with the smallest total is dropped, except that the two top candidates must remain. In case there are tied for second place, the top candidate and ties second-place candidate remain.) If the motion passes, a fifth and final ballot will be conducted.
- (m). If no election occurs by this time, the Election Chair announces the choice will be made by lot (from the "hat").
- (n). Lots are then drawn by teller, and the first one "out of the hat" is elected.

Section 15.06. Order of Election: It is recommended that the Order of Election of the officers and the Committee Chairpersons be as follows:

- (a). Chairperson
- (b). Assistant Chairperson
- (c). Treasurer
- (d). Recording Secretary
- (e). Two members of the Office Operations Committee
- (f). Teleservice Chairperson
- (g). By-Laws/Procedures Review Committee Chairperson
- (h). Buck of the Month Committee Chairperson
- (i). P.I./C.P.C. Committee Chairperson
- (k). CCFAA Delegates to NCCAA.

Section 15.07 The Office Manager shall publish the results of the election in the December "By The Way."

Did You Know

A Declaration of Unity

*This we owe to A.A.'s future:
To place our common welfare first;
To keep our Fellowship united.
For on A.A. unity depend our lives.
And the lives of those to come.*

The following excerpts from a Grapevine article by A.A.'s co-founder Bill W. represent principles which have been reaffirmed by the members of the A.A. General service Conferences of 1969, 1970 and 1972.

- "The problem of drug addiction in its several forms lies close to us all. It stirs our deepest interest and sympathy. Many A.A.'s, especially those who have suffered these particular addictions, are now asking, "What can we do about drugs—within our Fellowship, and without?"
- "Specifically, here is a list of questions we are often asked:
 1. "Can a nonalcoholic pill or drug addict become an A.A. member?"
 2. "Can such a person be brought, as a visitor, to an open A.A. meeting for help and inspiration?"
 3. "If so, should these nonalcoholic pill or drug users be led to believe that they have become A.A. members?"
 4. "Can a pill or drug taker, who also has a genuine alcoholic history, become a member of A.A.?"
- "Now there are certain things that A.A. cannot do for anybody, regardless of what our desires or sympathies may be. Our first duty, as a fellowship, is to insure our own survival. Therefore, we have to avoid distractions and multipurpose activity.
- "Sobriety—freedom from alcohol—through the teaching and practice of the Twelve Steps, is the sole purpose of an A.A. group. Groups have repeatedly tried other activities, and they have always failed. It has also been learned that there is no possible way to make nonalcoholics into A.A. members. We have to confine our membership alcoholics, and we have to confine our A.A. groups to a single purpose. If we don't stick to these principles, we shall almost surely collapse. And if we collapse, we cannot help anyone.
- "I see no way of making nonalcoholic addicts into A.A. members. Experience says loudly that we can admit no exceptions, even though drug users and alcoholics happen to be first cousins of a sort. If we persist in trying this, I'm afraid it will be hard on the drug user himself, as well as on A.A. We must accept the fact that no nonalcoholic, whatever his affliction, can be converted into an alcoholic. . . . and an A.A. member.
- "We cannot give A.A. membership to nonalcoholic addicts. But, like anyone else, they should be able to attend open A.A. meetings, provided, of course, that the groups themselves are willing."

C. Office Operations Committee Chairperson – Frank D for Valerie C:

Central Office will begin on-line bill paying next month. Only 3 persons showed up for the OOC meeting therefore nothing could really be done.

Beverly attended the Office Manager's Conference in North Carolina. Out of 66 people in one workshop only 18 did not sell "drunk junk". Of those 18 who didn't, more than half charged between \$7.50 and \$8.00 for a Big Book. Group contributions are not enough to cover the expenses of the Central Offices. Most Treasurers of Central Offices are 2-year commitments. Of the 150 offices represented, the majority had the same concern: how do we make more money. -- Some offices have no health insurance, sick leave, vacation and retirement benefits. -- There was a lot of discussion regarding fund-raisers. -- Old timers said go back to the old days; younger people said the old days are dead, leave them that way. -- Some locations have "pocket meeting lists" that are changed twice/yr. Proposed By Laws & Procedures Changes.

Purpose: Clarification of the following Articles & Sections.

Current:

Article IV, Section 4.07. Delegates elected to an elective office, other than the Office Operations Committee, the Teleservice Committee, the Buck of the Month Committee, and the P.I./C.P.C. Committee, and the Special Needs Committee shall resign their position as a Delegate to the C.C.F.A.A. This rule also applies to Delegates selected to serve unexpired terms of office.

Proposed Change:

Article IV, Section 4.07: The following officers (C.C.F.A.A. Chairperson, Assistant Chairperson, OOC Chairperson, Treasurer, and Recording Secretary) elected to full or partial terms shall resign their position as Delegates to the C.C.F.A.A. Delegate Body. Their group may then replace them with a new voting Delegate. All other elected positions will maintain their Delegate voting privileges.

Current:

Article XVI, Section 16.01. Elected Officers and Chairpersons may participate in discussions, but shall not vote upon any issue with exception of the Teleservice Committee Chairperson, the Buck of the Month Committee Chairperson, and the P.I./C.P.C. Chairperson, and the Special Needs Committee Chairperson, if serving as Delegates and voting on behalf of their group.

Proposed Change:

Article XVI Section 16.01: The following elected officers (C.C.F.A.A. Chairperson, Assistant Chairperson, OOC Chairperson, Treasurer, and Recording Secretary) may participate in discussions, but are excluded from voting. All other elected positions will continue to exercise their Delegate voting privileges.
