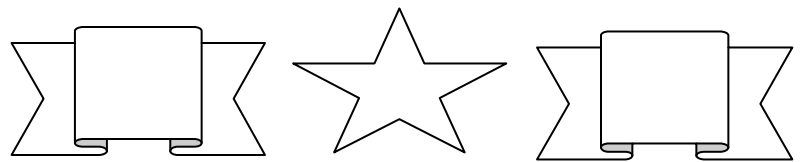

The meeting began at 6:00pm with the Serenity Prayer. Those attending were as follows: Lee P., Bill D., Ray L., Steve B., Terry S., Brian B., Mike K., John Q., and Rae W. (Office Manager).

Office Manager's Report:

1. The HVAC units in the new office have been serviced and cleaned by the landlord and they will now be maintained by CCFAA as per the agreement.
2. A new garbage disposal with necessary accessories has been installed in the new office.
3. The trash compactor has been sold for \$320.00.
4. CCFAA has applied for a \$466.00 reimbursement from the landlord for unexpected move-in expenses incurred and we are awaiting an answer.
5. We have enrolled in SMUD's Commercial Prescriptive Lighting Incentive Program and are waiting for the determination of eligibility. This program is free to small business and SMUD pays the contractor to install new T5/T8 fixtures, lamps and ballasts with occupancy sensors. This should reduce our lighting costs by 30-35%.
6. There is still a need for volunteers to assist in assembling and mailing both the monthly By-the-Way and the flyers. Dates for these activities are posted in each and every By-the-Way. Please notify the Central Office if you can be of service in these areas.

OOO Chairperson's Report:

1. The probationary contract between Rae W. (CCFAA Office Manager) and CCFAA will terminate on 01 September 2008. The members of the CCFAA Office Operations Committee, after some discussion, have agreed, unanimously, to recommend, to the CCFAA Delegate body, that Rae W. be hired as the permanent CCFAA Office Manager.
2. The move to the new Central Office has been completed and all expenditures related to the move have ended. A breakdown of the costs for the move will be provided to the Delegates at the August Delegate Meeting.
3. The donors to the Faithful Fivers may have their names published in the BTW if that is their desire.
4. The Office Operations Committee has begun to prepare a 2009 CCFAA Budget and will present a proposal to the September Delegate Meeting.
5. The July CCFAA Treasurers Report was briefly discussed and will be presented to the Delegates on Saturday

1. The OOC will be manning a literature/informational table at the upcoming CCFAA Annual Picnic on Sunday, August 17, 2008 at Elk Grove Park.

D. Treasurer – Ray L.

1. Income for July was slightly above target based on budget projections. The primary income items (Literature sales & Group Contributions) are below budget by 5 - 10% year to date.

The income primarily consists of ----

- AAWS literature sales; \$7,962 actual vs \$7,625 projected, just over the monthly projection.
- Group contributions were \$9,471 actual vs \$8,416 projected: just about \$1000 over projected.
- Birthday contributions (Please encourage group participation) and Office Services revenue both exceeded projection.
- The newly initiated Faithful Fivers program continues on a very positive note and has contributed an additional \$5,518 year to date. Please, PLEASE encourage your group members to participate.

Gross profit for the month was \$14,184.68; year to date is \$83,366.23 versus \$87,500 budgeted.

2. Expense – Expenses for 2008 will be paid on an "as occurred" basis versus "last minute".
 - Moving expenses were \$7,909 overall. This expense item is detailed in a separate spreadsheet provided with this month's report and will be published in the By-the-Way.
 - Any individual Members who might wish to make a contribution to help defer this un-budgeted expense might do so by sending a contribution to Central Office
 - Total Expenses for the month were \$18,133, versus \$12,500 budgeted.

CCFAA Delegate's Meeting Minutes – August 16, 2008 (cont'd)

- 5720 – Occupancy Improvement = \$1834.90, 5415 – Clerical Wages = \$4129.25 (addl. Staff hours), and 5416 – Payroll Tax Expense = \$2,123.80 (Multiple months) were major contributors to this item.
- Resulting Net Income for the month was \$((3,948.49)) and \$(10,722.63) year to date.
- Exclusive of the office move, which was NOT anticipated in our budget, our Income/Expenses for 2008 thus far are in the ballpark of our projected budget.

SPIRITUAL EXPERIENCE

Alcoholics Anonymous, Third Edition

The terms “spiritual experience” and “spiritual awakening” are used many times in this book which, upon careful reading, shows that the personality change sufficient to bring about recovery from alcoholism has manifested itself among us in many different forms.

Yet it is true that our first printing gave many readers the impression that these personality changes, or religious experiences, must be in the nature of sudden and spectacular upheavals. Happily for everyone, this conclusion is erroneous.

In the first few chapters a number of sudden revolutionary changes are described. Though it was not our intention to create such an impression, many alcoholics have nevertheless concluded that in order to recover they must acquire an immediate and overwhelming “God-consciousness” followed at once by a vast change in feeling and outlook.

Among our rapidly growing membership of thousands of alcoholics such transformations, though frequent, are by no means the rule. Most of our experiences are what the psychologist William James calls the “educational variety” because they develop slowly over a period of time. Quite often friends of the newcomer are aware of the difference long before he is himself. He finally realizes that he has undergone a profound alteration in his reaction to life; that such a change could hardly have been brought about by himself alone. What often takes place in a few months could seldom have been accomplished by years of self discipline. With few exceptions our members find that they have tapped an unsuspected inner resource which they presently identify with their own conception of a Power greater than themselves.

Most of us think this awareness of a Power greater than ourselves is the essence of spiritual experience. Our more religious members call it “God-consciousness.”

Most emphatically we wish to say that any alcoholic capable of honestly facing his problems in the light of our experience can recover, provided he does not close his mind to all spiritual concepts. He can only be defeated by an attitude of intolerance or belligerent denial.

We find that no one need have difficulty with the spirituality of the program. *Willingness, honesty and open mindedness are the essentials of recovery. But these are indispensable.*
