Who Am I?

I was deeply touched by what I heard a young man at a meeting sharing about planning a party for his mother. He started to search through some old pictures and came up with photos of himself when he was 3 years old. Looking at them, he saw the innocence in his face at that young age and he said something like: "that little boy was not a jerk". I believe that everyone in the room could identify with him. What happened between then and now?

Most of us were perfect when we were born but something influences us in those formative years that set the tone for the direction that our thinking would take. The childlike innocence gave way to the *neediness and insecurity* that alcoholics seem to have in common. The unworthiness tapes run rampant in our heads telling us that we couldn't make it without cutting corners and doing things that brought on guilt and shame, then we were *plagued by our conscience*. That little child was damaged and scared on the inside in a way that nothing could bring him peace, until he discovered the *elixir in a bottle*. When that failed him, he showed up in the rooms of Alcoholics Anonymous trying to make sense of it all.

When I look around the room at an A.A. meeting, it seems like we all look about the same on the surface, with a few minor differences due to age and generational things. We're all made up of hair, eyeballs, elbows, and feet, and things like that. Most of us follow dress codes and courtesy standards. We're not that much different on the surface. Our real problems consume us on the inside and we spend years trying to convince the world around us that we are as good as they are while, inside, loathing what we had become. *It's hard to convince a drunk that the child that he was at 3 years old is still inside of him and can resurface if he desperately wants it.*

Suppose, for a moment, that we all woke up this morning with amnesia. We would all be the same. The only thing that makes us different is what is going on *between our ears and we drag that with us everywhere* we go. I discovered years ago that my brain, with the aid of my ego, was lying to me, and that I wasn't that hopeless loser that I thought I was. I also discovered that most of that damage could be reversed, and that I could, over a period of time; develop an approach to a life far superior to anything I could have imagined. The hardest thing that stands in the way of this is my inability to surrender, and to trust *the process*. With the help of the group and slowly letting go of some of the old ideas, you can start seeing the results in a short period of time, and it will be exhilarating. However, we didn't get this way overnight, and it will be a slow journey, but a very exciting and happy experience. An old, departed friend used to say, "*Your hair will be a different color before you know who you are.*" To that end, with the help of the A.A. program, you will patiently change some of those old habits that cause you grief, and replace them with unselfish deeds that start to heal the conscience. I've heard it said, "Try it for 90 days and if you don't like what we have to offer, we will gladly refund your misery". What have you got to lose? *Now, let's go find that kid and give him a second chance.*

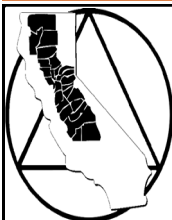

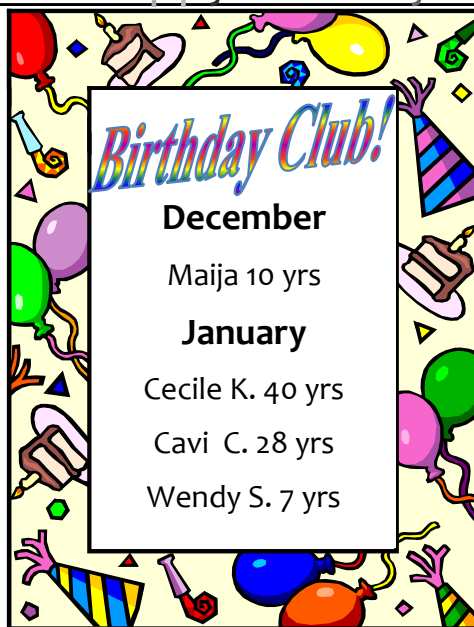

The First Step

“We admitted we were powerless over alcohol—that our lives had become unmanageable.”

It is no coincidence that the very first Step mentions powerlessness: An admission of personal powerlessness over alcohol is a cornerstone of the foundation of recovery. I’ve learned that I do not have the power and control I once thought I had. I am powerless over what people think about me. I am powerless over having missed the bus. I am powerless over how other people work (or don’t work) the Steps. But I’ve also learned I am not powerless over my attitudes. I am not powerless over negativity. I am not powerless over assuming responsibility for my own recovery. I have the power to exert a positive influence on myself, my loved ones, and the world in which I live.

The First Tradition

“Our common welfare should come first; personal recovery depends upon A. A. unity.”

The Traditions are neither rules, regulations, nor laws. No sanctions or punishments can be invoked for their infraction. Perhaps in no other area of society would these principles succeed. Yet in this Fellowship of alcoholics, the unenforceable Traditions carry a power greater than that of law. For years now, we have seldom seen a serious departure from them. The example of the very few who have persistently ignored them has not caused others to follow suit. We obey our Traditions willingly because of the need for AA survival. We obey them because we ought to and because we want to. Perhaps the secret of their power lies in the fact that these life-giving communications spring out of living experience and are rooted in sacrificial love. *-Language of the Heart pg 248-249*

The First Concept

“The final responsibility and ultimate authority for A. A. world services should always reside in the collective conscience of our whole Fellowship.”

The A.A. groups today hold ultimate responsibility and final authority for our world services—those special elements of over-all service activity which make it possible for our Society to function as a whole. The groups assumed that responsibility at the St. Louis International Convention of 1955. There, on behalf of Dr. Bob, the Trustees and A. A.’s old-time leaders, I made the transfer of world service responsibility to our entire Fellowship. Why, and by what authority was this done?...The fact had to be faced that A. A.’s founders were perishable. When Dr. Bob and I had gone, who would then advise the Trustees; who could link our little-known Board to our thousands of groups? For the first time it was seen that only a representative conference could take the place of Dr. Bob and me.

There is a Solution

Almost none of us liked the self-searching, the leveling of our pride, the confession of shortcomings which the process requires for its successful consummation. But we saw that it really worked in others, and we had come to believe in the hopelessness and futility of life as we had been living it. When, therefore, we were approached by those in whom the problem had been solved, there was nothing left for us but to pick up the simple kit of spiritual tools laid at our feet. We have found much of heaven and we have been rocketed into a fourth dimension of existence of which we had not even dreamed.

A Family of A.A. Friends

You'll find there's a family of friends living here,
 A small group of minds, and of hearts;
 With some of us clever and some of us not,
 At times you can't tell us apart.
 There's one who is cranky and one who is shy,
 And one who is really uncouth;
 And just when you think you've discovered who's who,
 The truth that we're all just a little of each,
 A group of imperfects are we.
 And sometimes I might criticize them to you,
 But, don't ever knock them to me.
 'Cause the one thing that ties us together for life
 No matter how far we're apart,
 Is love for each other,
 A family of A.A. friends,
 A small group of minds, and of hearts.

The Big Book Manuscript Edit Was Vitrally important!

Bill W finished the pre-publication manuscript (Multilith) for the book, Alcoholics Anonymous, in December of 1938. It read like a book of absolute prescriptions e.g.: "*Thou shalt under pain of drunkenness,*" e.g. :

"Rarely have we seen a person fail who has thoroughly followed our path **directions.**"

"If you have decided you want what we have and are willing to go to any length to get it - then you are ready to take certain steps **follow directions.**"

"At some of these we balked **you may balk.** We thought **You may think** we could find an easier, softer way. But we could not **We doubt you can.**"

"... One who has all power - that One is God. May you **You must** find Him now!"

These few authoritarian (Thou must) examples are on page 58, but this theme travels throughout the entire *step explanation pages* of the Manuscript.

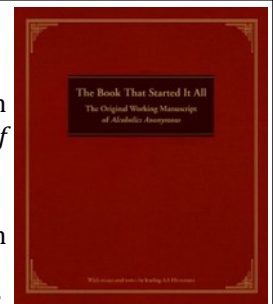
In January of 1939, Bill W sent four-hundred manuscripts to members, friends and other allies for comments and evaluation. These were returned with only a few suggestions. However, Hank Parkhurst's friend, Dr. Howard, a psychiatrist from Montclair, New Jersey, recommended toning down the use of "*musts*" to: "*we ought*" or "*we should*"—etc. Also, instead of the authoritarian word "**you**" to use the word "**we.**" (Dr Silkworth and Dr. Tiebout offered similar advice). After all, many of the skid row alcoholics had been repeatedly badgered by do-gooder advice at the missions.

I believe this caused a major change in the tone of the Big Book—it immediately changed from a book of **prescriptions** to one of **descriptions**—from "*Thou must*" to "*This is what we did.*" I note that page 58 of our current Big Book announces: "*If you have decided you want what we have and are willing to go to any length to get it, . . .* What an appealing choice!

A professor from NY University, Tom Uzzell, was paid \$380 (\$6,419 today) to edit the manuscript in a more professional manner which reduced the pages from over six-hundred to four-hundred.

Another concern was the religious mode. Many wanted a religious tone (mostly Akron members) style while some New Yorkers favored the psychological angle. Arguments ensued! However, Jimmy Burwell came up with the compromising phrase: "*God as we understood Him*". Bill called this statement a ten-strike! (Of course, Ebby Thacher told the same to Bill on page 12.).

A scribbled in pencil "Too Groupy" conveyed that a phrase was too much like the religious Oxford Group. An example of this can be found on Manuscript page 43 . . . Bill had written: "*When you awake tomorrow **morning**, look back over the day before. Were you resentful, selfish, dishonest, or afraid?*" The words "Oxford Group" are hand written just above these words to signify needed change. This was changed to: "when we retire at **night** . . .", etc. as on page 86 of our current Big Book. Without the above two major changes, would the Big Book have sold? I doubt it! Bill W wrote the Big Book, but he had lots of help. Thank you, God!
