MY DELAY WAS NEVER GOD'S DENIAL

"When the pupil is ready, the teacher will appear." I recall hearing those words in one of my first AA meetings over 24 years ago. It touched home for me since I felt like a kid in a "spiritual kindergarten" (*As Bill Sees It*), learning the truth about my alcohol problem which span almost three decades. Not drinking was my simple aim at first, but soon, I discovered it wasn't about the bottle of booze, it was about finally dealing with a lifelong disease the Big Book calls "a spiritual malady."

I had made a pit stop in AA at the midway point through a friend's intervention, but did not stay. I left AA, forsaking my sanity, safety, peace of mind, and serenity, to once again wallow in the dark world of the alcoholic drinking with the old threadbare idea, "This time will be different; this time I will control and enjoy my drinking." It began a long period of stopping, then starting, then stopping – just one long drunk with pauses in between.

But on June 24, 1993, I was ready...in fact, my God was very patient waiting for me. My clarity was of an insanely possessed person begging for God to come and die. My exact cry for mercy was, "God, please help me, and, if you cannot, then take my soul because I cannot go on living like this." On that morning, I made a conscious contact with a Higher Power who today I call God.



A member said, "My delay isn't God's denial," and spoke of a Path to a useful and happy life, free from the bondage of alcoholic obsession. I became an eager student ready to listen; ready to learn; and ready to move forward with my life...*finally!* But, for this stubborn alcoholic, it was a "sometimes slowly" process. It would take much patience, tolerance, and willingness, along with the burning desire to change.

Through my **Step 4** inventory and subsequent amends list, I made an accurate and unsparing amends list (*as I understood it at that time*) which opened "emotional wounds, some old, some long forgotten, and even some still painfully festering after many years." Our **Step 8** states, "it may look like a purposeless and pointless piece of surgery, but if a willing start is made, then the great advantage of doing this process will so quickly reveal truths and the pain will be lessened as one obstacle after another melts away."

The very spirit of **Step 9** cautions us to not delay because of fear, but to be responsible and to take the full consequences for our past acts.

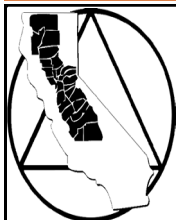

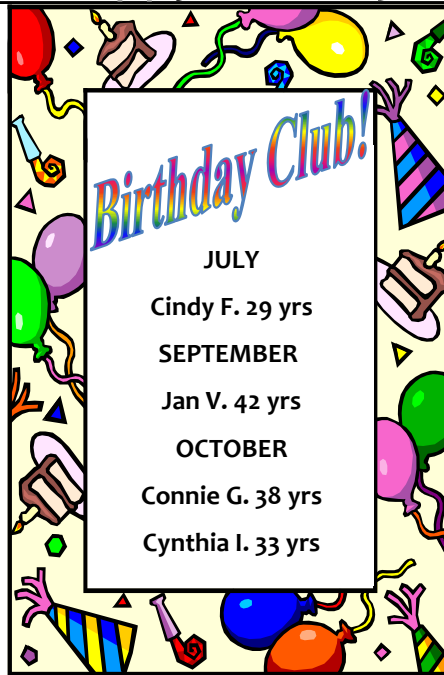

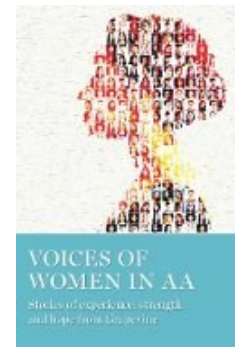

MY DELAY WAS NEVER GOD'S DENIAL Continued from pg. 1

Recently, a real life story, touching and emotional, unexpectedly reopened old wounds, and, due to long time sobriety, I inventoried them through quickly. Forgiveness followed, and, more importantly, understanding and compassion for the alcoholic who suffered from this disease. Expressing *thanks* for the uncomfortable moments helps me to move on from them more easily.

The simple, straightforward message of this life changing, lifesaving program is:

We are alcoholic and our life had become unmanageable,

That no human power can relieve our alcoholism,

That God could and would if He were sought.

So it is in the seeking every day from our heart, that the grace of a loving God can enter, and expel the obsession for drink and other substances which can no longer serve any useful purpose in our day's march. But God cannot render us white as snow without our cooperation. We have to cooperate with God's plan or it will not materialize – that has been my experience. All the other is wishful thinking, and it isn't enough.

Whenever you are down, remember your real reliance must always be upon God. The more we move toward God's will, the closer we get to doing God's will. Your self-esteem in life is not based on fancy clothes, or an expensive car, or grandiose delusional dreams. It is based on your relationship with God, one on one, and doing esteem able acts.

I read a different way to express a familiar prayer,

*“God, grant me the eyes to see
what I am supposed to see,
ears to hear what I need to hear,
a heart to feel what I need to feel,
and courage to do what needs to be done in this life.”*

Our Creator wants the best for all of us... even if we stumble. . As our Big Book says, *“You will surely meet some of us as you trudge the Road of Happy Destiny. May God bless and keep you until then.”*

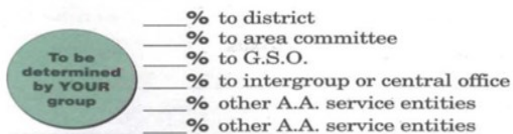

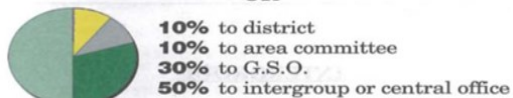
