As would be expected, much discussion during the CNIA Area or Committee Meeting in August centered around general service and the opportunities for such service. It is evident that there are plenty of opportunities to serve. A review of all of the Area service entities gives a good picture of these opportunities.

At local District Committees, at the Area Committee, and all the way to the General Service Board, servants are hard at work all year long.

At the Area level, work is ongoing on many activities:

 month of August 2020, Year to date is 77% of budget.
