Thoroughness and Honesty

But it is from our twisted relations with family, friends, and society at large that many of us have suffered the most. We have been especially stupid and stubborn about them. The primary fact that we fail to recognize is our total inability to form true partnership with another human being. Our egomania digs two disastrous pitfalls. Either we insist upon dominating the people we know, or we depend upon them far too much. If we lean too heavily on people, they will sooner or later fail us, for they are human, too, and cannot possibly meet our incessant demands. In this way our insecurity grows and festers. When we habitually try to manipulate others to our own willful desires, they revolt, and resist us heavily. Then we develop hurt feelings, a sense of persecution, and a desire to retaliate. As we redouble our efforts at control, and continue to fail, our suffering becomes acute and constant. We have not once sought to be one in a family, to be a friend among friends, to be a worker among workers, to be a useful member of society. Always we tried to struggle to the top of the heap, or to hide underneath it. This self-centered behavior blocked a partnership relation with any one of those about us. Of true brotherhood we had small comprehension.

Some will object to many of the questions posed, because they think their own character defects have not been so glaring. To these it can be suggested that a conscientious examination is likely to reveal the very defects the objectionable questions are concerned with. Because our surface record hasn't looked too bad, we have frequently been abashed to find that this is so simply because we have buried these selfsame defects deep down in us under thick layers of self-justification. Whatever the defects, they have finally ambushed us into alcoholism and misery.

Therefore, thoroughness ought to be the watchword when taking inventory. In this connection, it is wise to write out our questions and answers. It will be an aid to clear thinking and honest appraisal. It will be the first tangible evidence of our complete willingness to move forward.

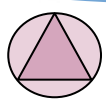

1. I audited February's expenses and payable. Everything is good and a signed copy is on file at the CCFAA office.
2. Literature sales for the month \$6,464 which is above budget by \$631 [line 4020]
3. Medallion sales were good at \$2577 above budget by \$577 [line 4035]
4. Group Contribution for February \$6,617 which is below out \$10,000 a month budget by \$3,383 [line 4100]. Many Groups make their contributions quarterly so we should a correction in the April P&L.
5. Birthday contributions of \$309 up from budget by \$142 [line 4120] Get the word out to for those that wish to contribute a little gratitude for their birthday.
6. Faithful Fivers struggled a bit in February \$885 income below budget by (\$615) [line4130]. This is a great way for us, as individuals, to support CCFAA.

Mr. R. didn't buy the program, telling Bill a very important facet of this program was our need to be self-supporting.....If you caught the film on the government project in the area to the south of us, you may have noted the necessity of keeping the drunks doing their thing, or losing out on public money. Bill W. was a piker when it came to trapping the "big money". But it wasn't fashionable, in that day, to want Big Brother to foot the bill for EVERYthing!.....We personally prefer the approach of, "Father! I'd rather do it MYSELF!!" If the "professional drunks" - both those continuing to drink, and those paid to administer to them - can continue to visit the public "trough" without becoming confused as to who is doing what to whom, they have our blessing.....But we are convinced more than ever that the local Buck of the Month Club is a MOST valuable investment. We have no statistics to back us up, but experience tells us there is nothing we can do for ourselves that government can't do for ten times as much money! It follows that a single buck keeping the A.A. door open must be equivalent to a LOT of government bucks doing the same thing.....And the only way A.A. can stay independent, can continue to work without bureaucratic domination, is for A.A. MEMBERS to put up the bucks to keep OUR door open. The day a single government cent comes our way, we're ALL on relief.....Let's preclude ANY possibility of government money EVER looking like a solution to the problem of alcoholism. About 10% of the local membership is doing so right now, by sending their buck to the Central Office.....Join us. If you feel as I do, that A.A. has actually saved YOUR life, \$12.00 per year doesn't loom too large. And it beats having a tax collector touching you for a whole lot more!

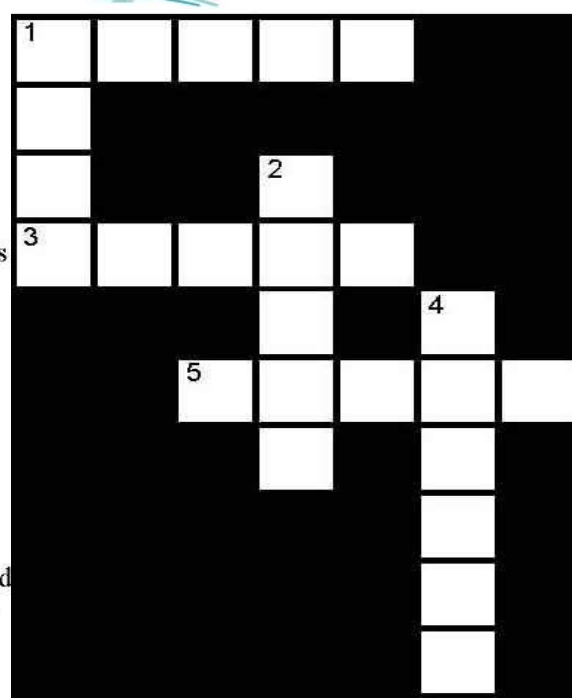

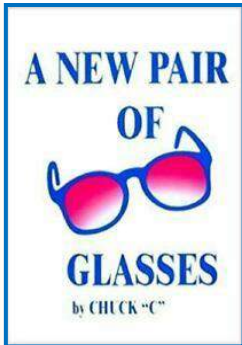

Now that's a tremendous statement. "I came to believe by watching the miracles in AA happen." And after this talk in St. Louis, we were going to get some coffee. Mrs. C. was with me and she said, "Chuck, maybe Father Ed would like to go with us for coffee." And I said, "Maybe he would, Honey, you ask him!" I didn't want to get turned down. I'm a sensitive alcoholic! So she asked him and he went. And we sat down in the booth and he started plying me with questions, and he never quit.

I would say every fifteen minutes, "Father. You talk. I've been talking all night. You talk. I love to hear you talk." But he'd ask another question, and the last question he asked was, "Chuck, tell me about the family. What's happened in the family? And I said, "No, Father, I won't tell you. Mrs. C.'s here; let her tell you."

And so, she told him what had happened in our family. And he sat there with his little mouth perched up, looking out the window, seemingly forever. That was a great habit of his; his mouth just looked like a little ol' rosebud, and he'd look off into space.

He finally turned to me, and he said, "You know something, Chuck?" And I said, "What, Father?" He said, "Sometimes, I have to believe that Heaven is just a new pair of glasses." I think that's one of the most profound statements I ever heard out of the mouth of anybody. "Sometimes I have to believe that Heaven is just a new pair of glasses." And that's exactly what this program has been for me. I said to my wife, "Honey, where's the difference?" This program is a new motivation and a new action pattern.

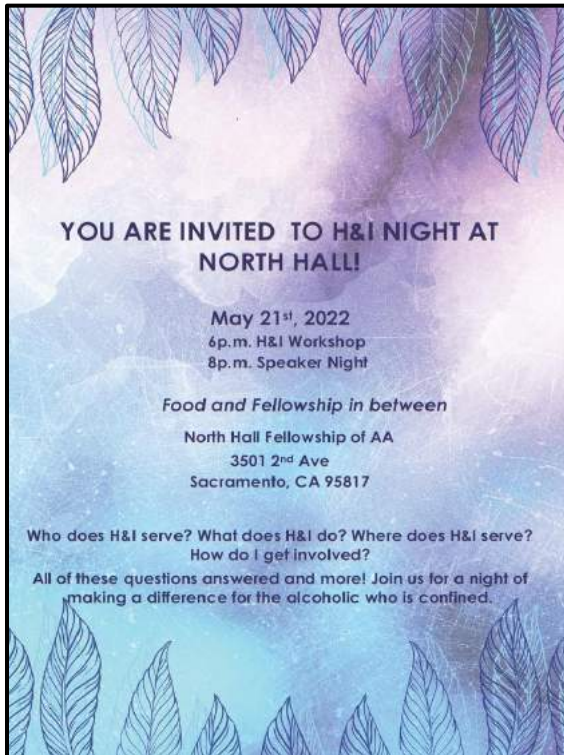

NEEDS VOLUNTEERS!



During the Covid outbreak many facilities shut down and many people that were of service doing H&I work went on to other things. We are now seeing a resurgence of facilities, Jails and institutions opening back up to in person meetings.

In the past Area 42 serviced some 32 facilities by bringing in meetings to Alcoholics that could not go out to meetings. Sixteen of those facilities have opened and more are on the way.

In addition, Area Chair Roger M. is reviewing five new facilities that are requesting meetings. What are facilities? These are the places that alcoholics find themselves when they hit bottom. Places like jail, prisons, mental facilities, rehabilitation centers, and transitional living facilities. H&I takes in meetings usually once or twice a week to facilities. Most volunteers go in once or twice a month. This means a commitment of 12 times a year. In some cases, a volunteer can go in just once in a while as a speaker to share their experience, strength, and hope. So how you might ask does this all work? Well H&I has a volunteer coordinator for each facility that acts as liaison to the facility and H&I. This person coordinates the weekly meetings with Contact Chairs. A contact Chair is the person who secretaries the actual meeting at the facility. For a facility that has one weekly meeting 4 contact chairs are needed for the month. In addition, Contact Chairs try to bring in AA Speakers to share their stories with the residents who many times are attending their first AA meetings. As you can see it takes a lot of people to make this all happen. This is where you get to reach out to the newcomer.

H&I Area 42 Meets each third Tuesday of the month at Denny's 7900 College Town Drive at 6:00 p.m... Come out join us for a cup of coffee and stay to help those who need it most. Want more information on how to get involved drop H&I a line at area42handi@gmail.com. You can also ask for and receive a list of facilities served as well as the contact information for that facility coordinator. The coordinator is the primary contact for persons wanting to volunteer their time. Each facility needs are also listed in the minutes of each H&I Committee meeting.

Thanks for taking the time to read and we hope to see you reaching out with us to the newcomer who is still suffering.

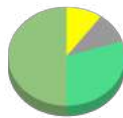
