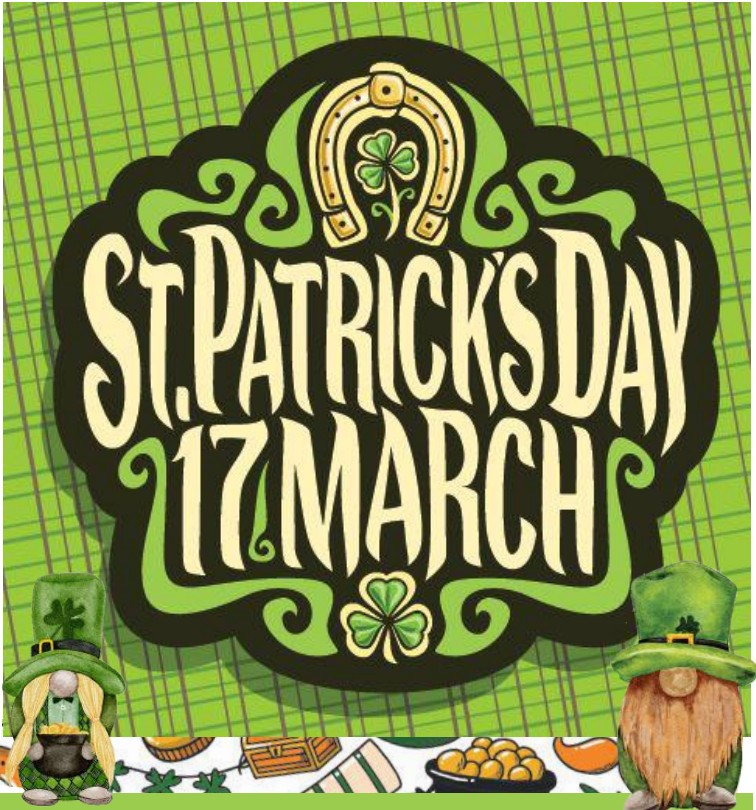




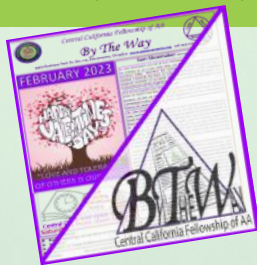

Surrender to Win

I remember having conversations with my family about the way that I drank. They were concerned about the way I drank and that I needed to get a job. For a string of years, I put my family through a waking nightmare.

I was self-righteous and stubborn. My relationship with alcohol became more intimate, and I became withdrawn from life. I felt like a parasite and that I didn't deserve a good life. Yet, at the same time, I felt that I was brilliant and way better than everyone else.

My life got put on pause a couple times by rehabs, doctors, courts, and hospitals. In late December 2000, I found myself in a hospital that I had been in four years earlier. In the padded room, after a tranquilizer shot, I found myself in tears, and thinking about my past. My family offered to send me to rehab, or leave their house. I was just shy of my twentieth birthday.

My first day sober was January 9, 2001 and this has remained my sobriety date. In rehab, they took us to AA meetings every day, and twice on the weekends. I kept hearing the same things. Go to meetings. Get a sponsor. Work the steps. Talk to other alcoholics. Pray. Now, I am able to do these five things daily. It has taken years for me due to my stubborn nature to let go and follow suggestions. I have made many mistakes over the course of my sobriety with relationships, jobs, money, and everything else.

I believe that if there has been one thing for certain, it is that I take an honest First step. In my heart, I felt that my life was truly screwed, and I was able to link that up with my relationship to alcohol, and that my thinking was distorted. Everything else for me has truly been a work in progress. I've gone through the Steps using the Big Book and Twelve and Twelve with my sponsor, studied the 12 Traditions, have a homegroup, and am excited about life most of the time.

But when the going gets rough, I forget that I am not the end-all of everything. This happens precisely when things do not go as I planned. When things go well, it's a lot simpler to "Let Go and Let God." I have heard many times that "you gotta surrender to win," and "easy does it." Having a lot of experience with resistance to suggestions, I forget more often than not, that the solution to my problem is just that—follow suggestions.

Today, my life is filled with many blessings. In a meeting yesterday, the topic was "how is spirituality working in your life?" While listening to those who shared, I was thinking that for me, spirituality has been seeing that my mistakes can be turned into valuable experience, listening more than talking, following suggestions, and "That God could and would if He were sought."

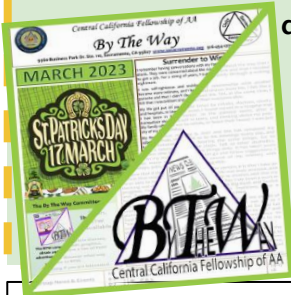

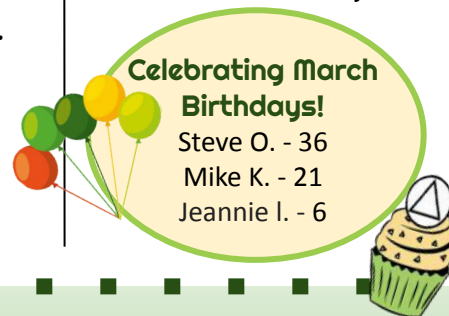

“That is why we all judge the newcomer less and less. If alcohol is an uncontrollable problem to him and he wishes to do something about it, that is enough for us. We care not whether his case is severe or light, whether his morals are good or bad, whether he has other complications or not. Our A.A. door stands wide open, and if he passes through it and commences to do anything at all about his problem, he is considered a member of Alcoholics Anonymous. He signs nothing, agrees to nothing, promises nothing. We demand nothing. He joins us on his own say-so. Nowadays, in most groups, he doesn’t even have to admit he is an alcoholic. He can join A.A. on the mere suspicion that he may be one, that he may already show the fatal symptoms of our malady.”

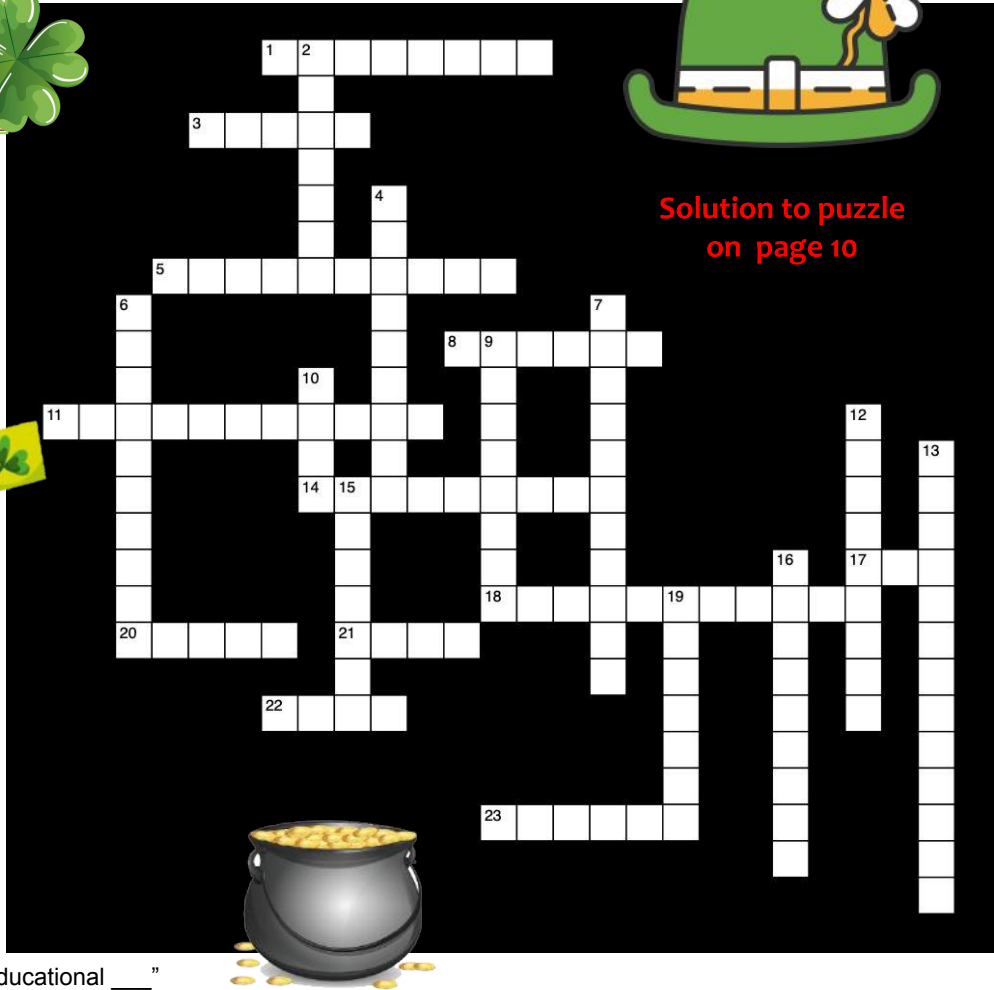

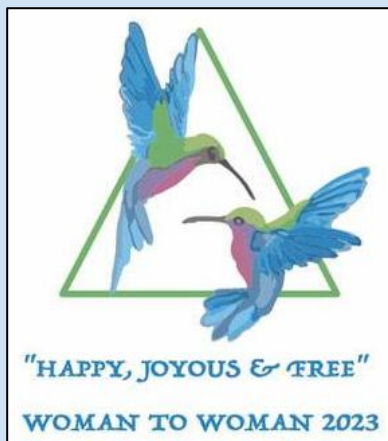

Open Meetings of Alcoholics Anonymous Welcome Everyone to the Fellowship

(NEW YORK, February 2, 2023) A remarkable effect can take place in an Alcoholics Anonymous group meeting when an individual struggling with a drinking problem asks for help and someone is there to share with them that AA may be a solution. For some AA members, their journey of sobriety began at “open” AA meetings, which can be attended by any member of the community, alcoholic or nonalcoholic. Open meetings have long been a vital source of information for anyone who wants to learn more firsthand about the AA Fellowship. The only request is that attendees not disclose the names of AA members outside the meeting so that members’ anonymity may be maintained.

A typical open meeting will have a “leader” and other speakers. The leader opens the meeting, introduces each speaker, then closes the meeting after sharing and discussion. With rare exceptions, the speakers at an open meeting are usually AA members. Each may share some drinking experiences that led them to join AA and they also may talk about how their life has changed because of the AA Fellowship and the Twelve Steps.

Open meetings are among the variety of meeting types offered by AA. “Closed” meetings are open to anyone with a desire to stop drinking, regardless of race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, income, or profession. There also are AA meetings specifically geared toward groups, topics, and communities, such as, young people, men and women, beginners, meditation, LGBTQ+, and online, to name a few.

More information on meetings and the Fellowship can be found in our Frequently Asked Questions pamphlet and on aa.org.

Open meetings are searchable by contacting a local A.A. office and by using the Meeting Guide app, where you can search by meeting type, location, day and time, and other features.

HOW TO KEEP NEWCOMERS AWAY FROM MEETINGS.

9. Give him a short commentary on all the members, recalling every uncomplimentary remark you've ever heard about each.
10. Finally, when the meeting ends, let him slink out alone.

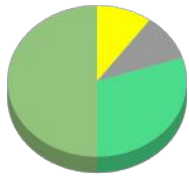
