In All Our Affairs

So I quit giving lip service to AA's Serenity Prayer and really began to use it. Over and over I kept saying, 'God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference.

As I slowly learned acceptance, my pain subsided. I began to wake up and look around. I began to see that my modest job was a means to living, and of serving society. The bigger and the better job could no longer be my chief aim. Then I looked at AA. What had I done for the Fellowship that had saved my life? Mighty little, I had to confess. So I began to go to meetings with a very different attitude. I quit my envy of financially well-heeled AAs and listened closely to what they said. I learned that their money was no longer a symbol of prestige; it was a trust for the best use to which it could be put. They also showed me that the temptations of riches could sometimes be worse than the pains of poverty. I also found that there was no such thing as 'unfortunate' AA—that is, if he were a real member. If sick, he was, by fine example, an inspiration to those both sick and well. If poor in pocket, he could often be rich in spirit, an eager worker and servant of our Society.

I now see that awakening and growing is something that never need stop and that growing pains are never to be feared, provided I am willing to learn the truth about myself from them.

The other day an old-time AA gave me an example which I'll never forget. Jack is a real old-timer. In fact, he started AA in my town. I used to envy him because he was a millionaire.

They told me he was in our local hospital, deathly sick, and about to die. In a way, I hated to go there, it would be so sad. When I walked into the room it was filled with AAs all in a happy mood. They were happy because Jack was happy. He was telling funny drinking stories, now and then wiping away blood that ran down his chin from a cancerous mouth. He sat upright, his legs and bare feet hanging from the edge of the bed. A nurse came in, remonstrating, begging him to lie down. Waving her away, he said, 'If I lie down flat on this bed, I might die now. And that would be too bad, because I want to go to our AA State convention next week.

We saw this was no bravado; he really meant it. A little later Jack again spoke of death. He said that he'd had a wonderful life. Whiskey had brought him great pain but, as a result, AA had given him great joy. With his 'awakening' in AA had come the utter conviction, indeed the sure knowledge, that 'in my Father's house there are many mansions.' Everybody there could see that to Jack, death was but a fresh awakening. He never did get to the AA convention.

But Jack knew, and we know, that this didn't really matter, for Jack was in full possession of 'the greatest gift of all.

WE'RE IN THIS TOGETHER

As Central Office Manager (COM), I constantly look for ways to improve and enhance the services Central Office (CO) offers to the CCFAA. Reducing cost and eliminating waste are priorities in the daily operations of this office. This year has been especially tough for everyone with rising cost in all areas of our lives. We have seen rising prices in gas, food, clothing, essentials, and entertainment. For us here at the Central Office (CO) costs have risen far above expectations. Utilities have risen between 12%-50%, paper cost have gone up 15%, Grapevine increased their prices 17%, and as anticipated AAWS has announced this month an increase to prices as well.

April 3, 2023 new prices for AAWS will go into effect, and generally reflect a 20% increase on books and a 30% increase on pamphlets (with rounding and some minor adjustments).

It was the position of this office to take advantage of the opportunity to stock up on the “core” items, Big Books and Twelve & Twelve’s in all formats before the increase so that we can extend the current prices on these items as long as possible to our fellowship. By April 1st we will have purchased over 1000 Big Books and 650 Twelve & Twelve’s. While this supply last, we will offer Big Books and 12x12”s at the 2022 price. There will be a 60 book/ per item limit during each purchase at the current price.

Once this inventory is depleted and we are placing orders again for these items with AAWS, the new prices will go into effect. Until then we are hoping that passing on this savings to the fellowship will enable more 12 step work to be possible and grow among our fellowship and community.

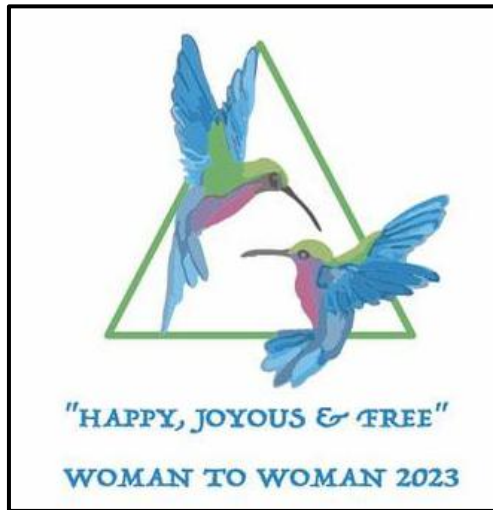

HISTORY OF THE NO. CA. WOMAN TO WOMAN CONFERENCE

The Thursday 5:45 PM meeting at Gibbons Club in Carmichael started Woman to Woman. The name of the group is Women's Happy Hour group and is still in existence.

A newly formed committee held a small meeting in 1980. It was at the home of Alma F. Gayle C. Pat V. Toni C. and Mary D. began the adventure. Shortly Doris S. and Jan V. became involved. It was held at the El Rancho Motel in West Sacramento. There were 60 women in attendance. There were meetings as well as a banquet speaker.

In 1981 we collected our own registrations and with that money bought flyers. No one had computers, printers or cell phones at that time. We had to hustle to get women interested. We always had to "sweat it out" to see if we had enough money to pay the bills. We had to learn to follow the AA traditions carefully. We check this out with AA New York office as well as our central office and were officially registered.

The 2nd conference was at the Woodlake Inn. The committee took turns be the chairperson for the conference and everyone pitched in to help. At the Woodlake Inn we bootlegged the hospitality coffee as we had no money for hotel coffee. Coffee was made in my bathroom and we supplied popcorn and munchies.

One year at the banquet speaker meeting we forgot the 7th tradition. Paying the hotel bill the next day was a scary adventure but our Higher Power must have helped because no checks bounced.

After 9 years we turned the gavel over to the Saturday morning women's group. The conference has continued to grow over the years and has become a very successful conference for women in AA.

☐ Treasurer's Report – Al E.

Please reference the Profit and Loss YTD Comparison February 2023 included in the attachments. Highlighted items reflect information in this report. Office is in great shape. Thanks to our office manager Robin, Staff, and Volunteers. February's deposits, expenses, payables, and bank reconciliation have been audited. Everything checks out and signed copies are on file at the CCFAA office.

1. Literature sales were ok-not great for the month at \$5,517 on a budget of \$6,000. [line 4020]
2. Medallion sales were great at \$3,642 with a \$2917 budget [line 4035]. All Kinds of new custom medallions and styles are available at the CCFAA store. They make great gifts.
3. Group Contribution were low at \$7,068 as we budgeted of \$10,750 [line 4100].
4. Birthday contributions were \$188 on a budget of \$167. **Tell a Friend, celebrate what one has so gratefully received.** [line 4120]. **Join the Birthday Club - Thank you AA for my sobriety!!!**
5. Faithful Fivers income was lacking at \$722 as we budgeted \$1,250 [line4130]. **(Great way for us, as individuals, to monthly support CCFAA directly.)**
6. Total Income was OK not great for February with \$21,898 on a budget of \$24,268. Our fellowship is amazing. [Total Income line]
7. Cost of Goods we're good \$6,124 less than our budget of \$7,481. [Total COGS].
8. Expenses Down (down is good here) slightly \$15,848 as our budget is \$16,787. [Total Expenses].
9. February's net income was low at **-\$73**. Remember last month's Net was 9,893. **THANK YOU AA**

Prudent Reserve – Is currently \$101,022 which is 6 months or operating expenses for that rainy day.

- 1. Open Saturdays – The Bookstore is open Saturdays 10am-2pm. Take advantage of these weekend hours to pick up literature for your group, fellowship, or yourself. We have Books, Medallions, Recovery themed cards, bookmarks, and so much more. Come by and see what we have to offer today.
- 2. April Special of the Month – 5 Slogans on Sale \$6.00 – Set of five beloved AA slogans, reproduced from the versions that first appeared in Grapevine in late 1956 and early 1957. (One slogan on each 9” x 12” page.) Great for AA meetings.

3. **AAWS Price Increase** – AAWS has announced that on April 3rd, 2023 they will implement a price increase of 20% on all books and 30% on all pamphlets. CCFAA has taken steps to reduce the impact of this increase on our membership by increasing our inventory on Big Books and Twelve & Twelve in all formats so that we can continue to offer these core items at the current price for an extended period of time. For more information, please see my “Manager’s Corner” in the April edition of the BTW.

Question: Michelle (*Sharing and Caring*) Thanks CCF for upping the inventory before the price increase. For groups that sell books at cost, we should revise our price list, correct ?

Answer: Yes.

Comment: We’ll post the new price list on the website soon. That way you’ll be able to have the new price list on all books and pamphlets for all the groups to see. It’s a significant list of items!

Question: Maria (*Best is Yet to Come*) When exactly does the price increase start?

Answer: It goes into effect 4/3/23. It will be all conference approved AA books & pamphlets, except Big Books and 12x12’s. If you order from <https://www.aa.org/> you’ll pay the new price. At CCF we are trying to build up inventory to have roughly 1,000 Big Books and 650 12x12’s. We estimate a 2-3 months supply for our membership to be able to extend the current prices for a few months at the 2022 prices.

Question: Stefanie A. (CCF Secretary) So if you’re a meeting literature person, you’ll purchase BB’s at the 2022 price at CCF until we run out of that supply, correct?

Answer: Yes. That’s what the Manager’s Corner will note in the April, 2023 By The Way. We are not sure about the demand. In April, we’ll have a better understanding about the demand from our membership in the first few weeks of the price increase, so after the increase has gone into effect, we’ll see the demand. Then we’ll be able to estimate how long our supply will last and be able to give an update on how long we’ll be able to keep the 2022 prices for BB’s and 12x12’s .

- 4. March 31st is the last day to submit applications for meeting/group insurance for the 2023-2024 policy year. If your group is in need of insurance please contact the Central Office at 916-454-1771 Monday – Friday 9am-3pm or for more info go to aasacramento.org under the resources tab/group insurance.
- 5. All of the 2022 Financial Statements, bank reconciliations, sales tax reports, and payroll tax filings are in the process of being reviewed by CPA Corp. They are now preparing the 2022 Federal 990 and State CT-199 reports which are due on May 15th. –Always working together.

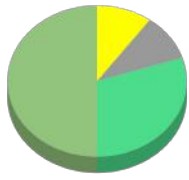
