Sharing Everything

I was not spiritual growing up; the concept of God was nonexistent for me. My parents raised me in a nonreligious but spiritually open-minded way of life.

When I came to AA I was offended by the spiritual aspect of the program. I just wanted to get sober! The beginning of my spirituality, I believe, started when I heard these hard-to-believe inspirational stories from the staff of my rehab. That's when I realized I was meant to be there. But who, I wanted to know, meant for me to be there?

After moving to California to enter sober living, I quickly acquired a sponsor and started the Steps because, when sober, I discovered that I am quite good at following directions. Even so, I didn't truly believe in a Higher Power until I did my Fifth Step and shared my life story with my sponsor.

The spiritual experience I had that day is something I will never forget. By that time I had been praying for a couple of weeks, even though I was not fond of it. Then, on the morning of the day I did my Fifth Step, I got the idea of praying for my Higher Power to give me signs of his existence.

My sponsor picked me up around noon and we went to a local park where people were walking their dogs. On this beautiful day in southern California, we sat down on a sun-bleached wooden bench. Over the next few hours, I shared my fearless moral inventory with this man I didn't know all that well. I didn't then understand the nature of the Steps' promises. I was really surprised that I would feel magically relieved and forgiving afterward.

When we were done, my sponsor told me that I should go and meditate for one hour so I could reflect on the work I had done so far and to see whether there was anything more I needed to add.

After my sponsor dropped me off at home, I rode my bike back to the same park for my meditation. When I arrived, I saw another sponsor and sponsee doing Step work while sitting on the very same sun-bleached bench that my sponsor and I had sat on earlier. They must have arrived minutes after we had left.

As I meditated on the day's events, I realized that something out there heard me pray that morning. I began to feel at peace with myself and my sobriety and felt a satisfying feeling, like finishing a nice Thanksgiving dinner with family. I was now convinced my Higher Power was watching out for me. It still is to this day.

This spiritual experience taught me that I'm never alone on my path in sobriety. Spiritual change is inevitable; accepting it is the best thing I can do.

WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE UPDATE?

On April 3, 2023 AAWS implemented a price increase on all conference approved literature sold through the New York office, 20% increase on books and a 30% increase on pamphlets (with rounding and some minor adjustments).

It was the position of this office to take advantage of the opportunity to stock up on the “core” items, Big Books and Twelve & Twelve’s in all formats before the increase so that we could extend the current prices on these items as long as possible to our fellowship. Who's your sponsor?

There seem to be as many views on sponsorship as there are views on a Higher Power. And the opinions on these matters run a parallel range of extremes, from warm-and-fuzzy friend to wrathful tyrant. In meetings I have heard people recount with visible glee the fury and condemnation their sponsors hurl at them.

“And then he said, ‘You moron! You did that in the Third Step!’” Perhaps this model of sponsorship seeks to duplicate early childhood experiences at the hands of gruff-but-innocuous parents. Other people share stories of selfless sponsors with unparalleled devotion to their sponsees—helping to bury the dog’s ashes; attending birthing classes.

My own sponsors have included one chronic relapser, a sponsor who refused to do anything other than read alternating paragraphs out of the Big Book, a sponsor who seemed most interested in giving me marital advice and a very wise old woman who would just smile knowingly when I would rant, rave and diagnose myself. My sponsees have included people who wanted to move into my garage on a long-term basis, one who fired me after the first session and another who seemed to use text messaging as a form of all-night entertainment. My best sponsees have been the ones who said things that made me think, Oh no, I’m worse off than that, and I’m supposed to be the sponsor! They are the ones who make me launch into action as soon as we hang up the phone or say goodbye.

One of the most rewarding moments of sponsorship is to hear a Fifth Step. There is no more profound a speech that a sponsee will ever make, nor a more essential audience that a sponsor will ever be. If there has been a thorough, well-guided Fourth Step, an attentive sponsor and a proper invocation to both persons’ Higher Powers, the Fifth Step is a monumental catalyst for transformation. When I say that I am a grateful alcoholic, one of the pillars of that gratitude is the ability to transform my rocky past into stepping-stones for my sponsee’s journey. It’s like turning poison into medicine. That is why we don’t regret the past or wish to shut the door on it. A sponsor has the privilege of using past experience to benefit others.

Our office is in great shape. **Thanks to our office manager Robin, Staff, and Volunteers.** March deposits, expenses, payables, and bank reconciliation have been audited. Everything checks out and signed copies are on file at the CCFAA office.

1. Literature sales were great for the month at \$8,286 on a budget of \$6,000. [line 4020]
2. Medallion sales were great at \$3,047 with a \$2917 budget [line 4035]. All Kinds of new custom medallions and styles are available at the CCFAA store. They make great gifts.
3. Group Contribution were amazing at \$19,633 as we budgeted of \$10,750 [line 4100]. Special Thank you to the Spring Fling contributions of \$8,578. Without this contribution we would be about our budget number. Special thanks to the Spring Fling committee and all who attended.

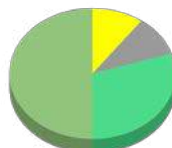
