Something Powerful in My Corner

Here in prison, it's sometimes really difficult to do the right thing all the time. I try really hard. I'm successful most of the time, but it often comes at a price. I work in a prison cable factory. The staff here has trusted me and put me in charge of the chemical room. I know that sounds kind of crazy, but I told them about being a recovering alcoholic. I actually prayed about this before I took the job. Because I work here, sometimes my fellow inmates want things that they shouldn't have. And because I try to be honest in all my affairs, I won't give it to them.

One day last month, that rule of mine got me into confrontation. An inmate thought I should give him something and a confrontation escalated. He told me he was "coming for me."

I have to say, I didn't act totally appropriately because I asked him in a voice that wasn't really nice, "Just how are you coming for me?" After the angry words left my mouth, a voice inside my heart said, "I got you." I believe that was my Higher Power. In that instant, I stepped back and told the man I was arguing with that it really didn't matter what he did, because I have something in my corner that's more powerful than he will ever be.

He stopped and gave me a look. "Well, if you believe in things like that," he said.

"I do," I told him, "And as long as I'm doing what's right, my Higher Power will have my back." I wished him a really nice day, turned and walked away.

I'd like to say I felt 100 percent better, and I did in fact feel a lot better. But there was a little piece of anger still left in me which told me that I was still trying to control it. I was holding onto that character defect. I wasn't trusting my Higher Power 100 percent. So, I stopped and prayed and asked him to remove it. That was when the peace came.

I went back to my cell block and the first thing I did was talk to my sponsor and tell him everything that had happened. I wanted to know if there was anything that I did for which I needed to make amends.

Sometimes, being honest and doing the right thing in this place isn't very easy. But I have seen over and over again, especially from my sponsor, that it is worth it.

I don't do this AA thing perfectly, but I sure am trying to do my best. The more I use the gifts that have been given to me—my sponsor, my Grapevine, the Big Book, meetings and the fellowship—the easier it will be.

We were only able to start an AA meeting here at our prison. Sometimes having a meeting is hit or miss, depending on the staff. One thing I can always count on though, is my Grapevines. Thank you so much, Grapevine, for doing what you do.







June's 2023 Delegates Meeting Treasurer's Report For May's 2023 End of Months Business

Please reference the Profit and Loss YTD Comparison for May 2023 included in the attachments. Highlighted items reflect information in this report.

Our office is in great shape. Thanks to our Volunteers, office manager Robin, and Staff. Drop in and say thank you.

May's deposits, expenses, payables, and bank reconciliation have been audited. Everything checks out and signed copies are on file at the CCFAA office.

- 1. Literature sales were down for the month at \$3,999 on a budget of \$6,000. [line 4020] Remember AA books are at the old price until inventory runs out, then there will be price increase due to AAWS price increase on all literature.
- 2. Medallion sales were ok at \$2,730 with a \$2917 budget [line 4035].
- 3. Group Contribution was down quite a bit with \$8,220 as we budgeted \$10,750 [line 4100]. Thanks to all the groups for the contributions to keep the office going for our fellowship.
- 4. Birthday contributions were \$97 on a budget of \$167 [line 4120]. Thank you AA for my sobriety!!!! Get the word out and celebrate what one has so gratefully received.
- 5. Faithful Fivers income was \$852 as we budgeted \$1,250 [line4130]. (Great way for us, as individuals directly to monthly support CCFAA.)
- 6. Total Income was off for May with \$17,793 on a budget of \$24,268 (-\$6,475). [Total Income line]
- 7. Cost of Goods Sold were down as we sold less, \$5,770 with our budget of \$7,481. [Total COGS].
- 8. Expenses Down (down is good here) slightly \$14,337 as our budget is \$16,787. Thanks to our office manager [Total Expenses].
- 9. <u>May's</u> net income was (-\$2,314).

Prudent Reserve – Is currently \$101,032 which is 6 months of operating expenses for that rainy day.


