

<u>December's</u> deposits, expenses, payables, and bank reconciliation have been audited. Everything checks out and signed copies are on file at the CCFAA office.

Please reference the Profit and Loss YTD Comparison December 2023 included in the attachments. Highlighted items reflect information in this report.

Thank you to our Volunteers, and special workers, Robin office manager, and staff.

December's deposits, expenses, payables, and bank reconciliation have been audited. Everything checks out and signed copies are on file at the CCFAA office.

- 1. Literature sales were great for the month at \$7,806 on a budget of \$6,000. [line 4020]
- 2. Medallion sales were good at \$3,382 with a \$2917 budget [line 4035].
- 3. Group Contribution was strong at \$11,947, as we budgeted \$10,750 [line 4100]. Thanks to all the groups for the contributions to keep the office going for our fellowship.
- 4. Birthday contributions off a bit \$65 on a budget of \$167 [line 4120]. Thank you AA for my sobriety!!!! Get the word out and HAPPY BIRTHDAY.
- 5. Faithful Fivers income was off slightly at \$988, as we budgeted \$1,250 [line4130]. This is a great way for us, as individuals, to directly support CCFAA each month. Sign up today at www.aasacramento.org click on DONATE then FAITHFUL FIVER.
- 6. Total Income was up for December at \$25,843 on a budget of \$24,268. [Total Income line]. Most groups make contributions at the end of each quarter. This was the quarter-end month.
- 7. Cost-of-Goods-Sold was good, \$10,679 with our budget of \$7,481. [Total COGS].
- 8. Payroll Expense Accrued increased by \$8,279. This represents a year-end adjustment for accrued but unpaid vacation and sick time for the Central Office employees. The related liability had not been adjusted since 2019. The accrued but unpaid vacation and/or sick leave has been calculated for each employee as of December 31, 2023, and the liability has been increased to the total as of that date.
- 9. Expenses were high at \$26,567, as our budget is \$16,787 [Total Expenditures] primarily due to the \$8,279 increase in Payroll Expense Accrued, as explained above.
- 10. December's net was a loss of \$(11,403.81), year-to-date Net Revenue is \$24,502 versus a budget of \$0.
- 11. The quarterly Statement of Financial Position (balance sheet) accompanies this report. The Prudent Reserve, calculated at six months of operating expenses, which equals \$101,052, is fully funded. It is held in the Business Advantage Savings account. The calculation of the prudent reserve is reviewed quarterly.

- Note the Accrued Paid Time Off liability of \$11,006.89, which totals the amount owed to CCFAA's employees for accrued but unpaid vacation 12. and sick time. The balance increased by \$8,279, as explained in 8., above. This liability will be adjusted annually at year-end to the actual amount owed. The annual adjustments should be significantly less than this year's adjustment.
- The balances in the Retained Earnings and Prior Period Adjustment accounts will be closed to Unrestricted Fund Balance as of 13. January 1, 2024, the beginning of the new accounting year. Non-profit accounting does not use the term "Retained Earnings," which is a for-profit accounting term. Non-profit accounting uses the term "Unrestricted Fund Balance" instead.


