

Faith over Fear


Faith over fear... what does that mean to you?







In the meeting it was discussed, voted on and approved to get a P.O. Box for all of our mail. We are doing this because our regular mailbox was broken into again. The office manager will give more information in her report.

Treasurer Report - Greg B.

Please reference the Statement of Activity Actual vs. Budget February 2024 included in the attachments. Highlighted items reflect information in this report. Thank you to our volunteers, special workers, Office Manager Robin, and staff.

February's deposits, expenses, payables, and bank reconciliation have been audited. Everything checks out and signed copies are on file at the CCFAA office.

- 1. Literature sales were strong for the month at \$8,538 on a budget of \$7,083. [line 4020]
- 2. Medallion sales were good at \$3,648 compared to a \$3,125 budget [line 4035].
- 3. Group Contributions decreased to \$8,398, as we budgeted \$12,000 [line 4100]. Year-to-date Group Contributions remain ahead of budget by \$2,461. Thanks to all the groups for the contributions to keep the office going for our fellowship.
- 4. Birthday contributions were good at \$223 on a budget of \$125 [line 4120]. Get the word out and HAPPY BIRTHDAY!
- 5. Faithful Fivers income was off slightly at \$695, as we budgeted \$917 [line4130]. This is a great way for us, as individuals, to directly support CCFAA each month. Sign up today at www.aasacramento.org click on DONATE then FAITHFUL FIVER.
- 6. The Insurance Program revenue was \$5,025 versus a budgeted amount of \$792 [line 4127]. Group renewals are due now, so revenue is seasonal. This variance should decrease as the year progresses.
- 7. Total Income was up for January at \$27,661 on a budget of \$26,894. [Total Income line].
- 8. Cost-of-Goods-Sold was good, \$8,187 with our budget of \$8,225, reflecting higher than budget literature and medallion sales. [Total COGS].
- 9. Payroll Expense was \$10,608 in line with the budget amount of \$10,998. [Total Payroll Expenses].
- 10. CCFAA received a small \$52 refund from our Workers' Comp carrier versus the budgeted expense of \$475 [Total Insurance]. The over budget variance is decreasing, as expected.
- 11. Utilities expense decreased to \$1,092 versus the \$1,304 budget [Total Utilities]. Telephone expenses decreased from \$1,921 in January to \$518 in February.

 The year-to-date over budget variance is down to \$770 from \$983.
- 12. Total Expenditures were \$14,999 compared to the \$18,669 budget. The year-to-date total is \$35,443, which is below the \$36,655 budget by \$1,212[Total Expenditures].
- 13. February's Net Revenue was \$4,463 versus a budgeted loss of \$183. Year-to-date Net Revenue is \$11,249, which is \$12,566 ahead of budget [Net Revenue].
